Continued from last weeks Bulletin....

Looking upon the crucified Lord, we come to realize that love gives life and that the death of Christ is the pathway to everlasting life. We are not celebrating death, rather, we are celebrating the life that was gained for us through the death of Christ on the cross.

Nailed to the cross, the Eternal Son commended his spirit into the hands of the Father so that we might have life and live it abundantly. Scripture tells us when Christ died, the earth shuddered and the tombs of the just were opened. We are still feeling the aftershocks today. When Jesus died on the cross, the boundary between death and life became the threshold of eternal life. Jesus's outstretched arms became the lasting sign of the Father's boundless merciful love for the human race. The agony and death of Christ brought the love of the Father to the farthest and darkest places in which humanity has been exiled. The rejection of the Son, freely accepted, demonstrates God's superabundant response to the longing in every human heart. The mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection is the anchor of our faith and the cause of our joy.

My brothers and sisters, let us turn our gaze towards the man of suffering suspended between earth and heaven keeping in mind that Jesus died for the very people who rejected him. As we gaze upon the cross, let us humbly acknowledge our sin and guilt. The cross is the seal of the Father's immense love. While it seemed for a time that evil had conquered, death did not have the final word. God did what no human could do. He brought life out of death. He conquered sin and restored lost innocence. He made a faithful people out of one that was unfaithful. Ever true to his word, He became the Father of all who were abandoned and fatherless.

We Adore You, O Christ, and We Bless You,

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I had mentioned at the later liturgy on Sunday that we are all part of the history of salvation and ideally part of the kerygma of the church. I was looking to join together the identity given us at Baptism that initiates a life within us and



the beginning of the instruction in the knowledge of the Gospel. The word “kerygma” is related to the Greek (I have Fr. Ettore Patrignoni to thank for his wisdom and insight) “keryx” which is 'to proclaim' to become a messenger. The two young children baptized began a history connected with being messengers and so bearers of the good news and the very presence of

Jesus within them. What followed was the Sprinkling Rite where we were also sprinkled with the water blessed which followed the renewal of our own baptismal promises. There is also some connection with the sprinkling of the lamb's blood on the door posts at the time of the Exodus. Done as they were told and obeying the Lord's command and His promise of deliverance. Their homes were set apart and under God's protection. I have read that there is a parallel offered by St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians. There we read in 5:7 'clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed.' There is some association with cleansing the house (spring cleaning) in preparation for the Passover. Perhaps our spring cleaning occurred during Lent in preparing for our renewal of our Baptismal promises. The shedding of the blood of Christ (originally connected to the aspercion) has again to do with being sprinkled we read in Psalm 50 'Sprinkle me with hyssop, Lord, and I shall be clean'. There is also another connection with the Old testament as hyssop was used to sprinkle the blood of the sacrifice, symbolizing the purification of the people.

As we continue through the season and anticipating Pentecost may we give thought to be free of any attitude or behavior that, in a sense, pollutes and contaminates our relationship with God and others. As a people who are part of the kerygma may our historical journey in Christ continue in this life and into the next until he returns as He has promised.

This week of the Octave of Easter merging into Divine Mercy Sunday is a week that shines on me and I love it. Tuesday's evening prayer reading was 1 Peter 2 "Come to the Lord a living stone" the Gospel for the day told of Mary Magdalene recognizing Jesus in the calling of her name. I have talked before how if you take away the rocks from the shore of Lake Superior over time they get dull. Somehow the stones have absorbed the water and it makes them glow and leaving that source changes the stone not in a physical way but an internal way. The glow is gone. It does not seem possible and yet over and over again I have watched it happen. (Please do not tell the state of Michigan, I do not think you can do this anymore.) This "living" stone has always given me the hope that when I follow my baptismal promises I am finding a way where the Holy Spirit has changed my heart in a significant way that is quiet, peaceful and loving. I have been exploring through Lent and will continue through Easter the meditation that when I say "I do" in my baptismal promises and I say "I believe" in the Creed there is the opposite of what "I do not" believe. This is a way that leads to an exploration of what I am truly saying. Do I acknowledge that there is something that I believe in and do not believe in. That in acknowledging both, I can fully recognize the voice that I follow, the loving voice that keeps me safe and I also understand about recognizing Jesus in the calling of my name. My thoughts for the past few days involved the idea that I need to change in a way that allows my heart to hear the call of my name given to me in baptism (and where I repeated at confirmation) and the knowledge that Jesus calls my name and, in those times, when I am listening I recognize his voice. I have also learned during the many Lenten seasons that for me to rejoice at Easter, is the journey to more fully acknowledge that over time I step away from the water of life in the distraction of life. That takes me away from the source that constantly changes and heals my heart so that it glows in the love that keeps me near the water. Like Mary Madelene I do not always recognize Christ immediately in my panic, frustration and stumbling of this life, but in prayer, I can hear a "voice" that becomes a nudge that says "Bobbi maybe you should come this way." I recognize the Spirit, I also recognize that the tomb may look empty, but Jesus is near and if I stop controlling something I can hear the "voice", I can hear the direction to go. Those times I am back at the water absorbing more of what makes my heart glow and gives me strength to continue. I am a living stone, I stay near the source and while I may sometimes walk away and becomes dull, it is the glow of Christ that has me coming back to say "I do"
