"[The command of the Lord] is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out (Deut. 30:14). "God has spoken and we need only heed his voice. Through the commandments, God has revealed his heart to us. Recall the words spoken by St. Paul in Athens, "In him, we live and move and have our being. As some of your poets have said, 'we are his offspring'" (Acts 17:28). Through baptism, we have been made members of the Body of Christ, who are near to the heart of the Son, who is near to the heart of the Father. Faith is an interpersonal relationship with the Living God who desires to speak heart to heart with us. The commandments of the Lord are not high and out there, no, they are deep within us, written on the tablets of our hearts. We have only to be still and listen to that small voice echoing in our hearts and then do what he tells us. Because the Word is in our heart, we have only to believe with the heart, that the promises of old are fulfilled in Christ and then conform our lives to what we have heard. I am reminded of the conferring of the Gospel Book during the rite of Ordination of deacons: "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you have become. Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach."

"The word of God is alive and active. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword. It can pierce the division between soul and spirit, joint and marrow. It can expose the innermost thoughts and desires of the heart" (Heb. 4:12). One who heeds the voice of God must be willing to be attentive to God and live in a relationship with Him because He desires to guide us. The Word of God is not an old musty document preserved on some dusty shelf of an abandoned, ancient archive. Granted, we can choose to ignore it, however, it will not ignore us. We can turn a deaf ear to the Word, but the voice that speaks it continues to echo in our hearts. "Even if we are unfaithful, He remains faithful because he cannot deny himself" (2 Tim. 2:13). God who reveals himself to us is unchanged and unchanging. "God is love. Everyone who abides in love lives in union with God and God abides in him" (1 Jn. 4:16). The Living Word has been implanted in our hearts by the Spirit of Love. Because we have been immersed in the waters of Divine Love, we are capable of producing the fruits of love. "When we speak the truth in love, we will grow in all things to be more like Christ who is the head" (Eph. 4:15). God is already in our hearts, molding our words to be as loving as they are in his heart.

God has made his dwelling among us. Through baptism and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, we have been made repositories of the implanted Word. Having been grafted to God who is ever faithful and ever true, we are challenged to live lives worthy of our calling. Speaking to the 2019 graduating class of the U of Utah, Rev. France A. Davis repeated a lesson he learned from his parents. "Be what you is and not what you ain't. Because if you ain't what you is, then you is what you ain't" (Rev. France A. Davis, U of Utah 2019 Commencement). If we wish to be the image and likeness of God who is the same yesterday, today, and forever, we must hold firm to the anchor of our soul, otherwise, we will be set adrift and be tossed about by every wind that blows our way.

"Be what you is." What are we? "The people God loves and has chosen to be his very own who must clothe themselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience" (Col. 3:12). "Don't be what you ain't" We are challenged to be authentic, not artificial or phony. Jesus made the point when he said, "Each tree is recognized by its fruit. People do not pick figs from thornbushes or grapes from briars" (Lk. 6:44). If we cooperate with the movement of the Spirit, we can have the attitude and mindset of Christ who stripped himself of all his divine privileges and clothed himself in the abject lowliness of a slave. More than that, he stripped himself of every pretext of human dignity and freely embraced the degradation of the cross. Faithful to his mission, he loved those who were his own to the end (CF. Phil 2:5-7). We are to be faithful because He is always faithful. While its grammar may hurt sensitive ears, Dr. Davis's closing remark is most appropriate. "If you ain't what you is, then you is what you ain't"

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The celebration of the Transfiguration had both the elements of direction and judgment in that what was spoken in the reading from Daniel was also shared in the Book of Revelation. The words "One like a Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven" are also written in Revelation 14:14 anticipating the final judgment. In Daniel we read 'the one like a Son of Man received dominion, glory and kingship' and that His dominion is an everlasting dominion.



The appearance of Moses and Elijah prompted Peter to ask if he and the other two (James and John) might set up tents. Tents were used during the Feast of Tabernacles and were part of the pilgrimage feast once a year. We appreciate that no response was given and that what followed was the voice of the Father who said "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." I gave some

thought to how the concept of being tabernacled with and tented as well with the presence of Jesus in our sacramental life. We are receptacles of the Body of Jesus. Theologically Jesus is the second Adam. Through His sacrifice we are restored to right relationship to the Father. Thinking about the first Adam and the consequences of disobedience we may say both he and Eve heard but neglected to obey. Their refusal was a choice. The reversal of the original sin through the passion and death and resurrection of Jesus has me thinking as to how well I listen to the direction of the Lord as a tented presence and tabernacled with Him. The overshadowing of the cloud was indicative of the presence of the Father and we read as well that Moses in Exodus 19:19 received communication about the commandments at Sinai. We know that obedience was a problem inclusive of obstinate hearts. Inasmuch as our first parents biblically were disobedient we too have the capacity to listen but not adhere. Earlier in the week we celebrated the dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary Major. Dedicated to Our Lady who heard the Word of God and accepted it. It was also at Cana that she said to the stewards "Do whatever He tells you" In our pilgrimage through life may we be attentive to the words of Jesus. May we appreciate how as 'tented presences' that we too are tabernacled with the Word made flesh.

This past week on Tuesday we celebrated the Memorial of Saint John Vianney. The scripture reading at Evening Prayer was 1 Peter 5:1-4. speaks of pasturing to the elders of the church and God's flock being in my midst, give it a shepherd's care. The Old Testament reading at Mass was from Jeremiah 30. The last line of the reading from Jeremiah at Mass was "You shall be me people and I will be your God." During the reading from evening prayer there is an invitation to be pastoral in the world. To be a shepherd for the Good Shepherd and to willingly be shepherded by Jesus and be an example for those around me. I smiled and thought to myself, "am I shepherd or sheep?" But the smile because I am both. In 1 Peter it was to the elders of the church and about a shepherd's care. Jeremiah reminded me what God's mercy, forgiveness and compassion look like. It looks like restoration and rejuvenation. It looks like what acknowledgement of my sins and asking God to help me walk in a path, that changes my heart and going out into the world would look like if I do so whole heartedly. 1 Peter says it is to the elders of the church and I acknowledge that it is over time, lots of time, in prayer, silence, Eucharist and Confession that I have continued to learn this. That it is walking this path and living in the world, that I stay on this path. It is in my ongoing and continuing relationship with God that I am His and I choose to stay there, grow and take myself out into the world as a child of God. That makes me both sheep and shepherd. Not a sheep in shepherd clothing but a sheep that has learned to participate in this world that leaves open the possibility that someone can follow me to encounter Christ themselves. It is in Christ that I acknowledge that I failed sometimes but am not defeated because God does love me. I know that more and more every day. At 68 years old, I acknowledge that I am in the elder category, but that I learned the lessons over time and do encounter the lesson every day, that I am sheep and shepherd to others. That there are times I need to follow and times I need to reach out and help someone else and in doing so, the encounter gives the image of God to those who need to encounter the love of God. I would also like to acknowledge here, that I love that God is always with me and that I can say to someone else, that God will always be with them. In my statements of faith, this is what has come with age. That when I say "I believe" I am also saying what I do not believe. I do not believe that God will ever abandon me, although sometimes in the past, I acknowledge like in Jeremiah, that I have abandoned God. It is in that acknowledgement and his constant invitation back that my faith has grown. I have learned a shepherd's care and learned to give a shepherd's care. I have learned to follow the flock as long as the Good Shepherd is leading. It is in God's love for me, I accept the invitation every day to be the person that God wants me to be. In what God wants me to be goes out into the world with God's image. It is God's image in me that acknowledges and lets the world know, that I am God's and God is mine.

*An Evening of Reflection:*

In March, we briefly introduced the  
Ignatian prayer known as  
*The Examen*. This evening,
