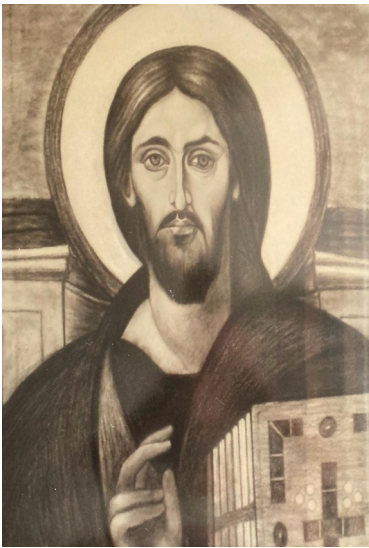
"It was the LORD who sent me to prophesy against this house and city all that you have heard" (Jer. 26:12). The prophet does not speak on his own authority. This is confirmed in a comment made by the prophet Amos. "I was not a prophet, and I was never trained as one. I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore trees. It was the Lord who took me from following the flock and sent me to preach to his people Israel" (Am. 7:14-15). God not only called the prophet, but he also put a huge burden on him, the need to speak a message that would bring salvation to the people. God allowed the prophet to see what he saw. God opened his heart to the prophet and allowed him to feel the agony of suffering humanity in all its horror. The prophetic utterance is the voice that God lends to the silent agony of the poor. God reveals his compassionate love through the empathic words of the prophet.

God's compassionate love for the poor and needy was, and remains, a challenge to the rich. The word of the Lord is rooted in compassion, not compromise. The prophet speaks of justice and mercy. Living among the people, the prophet's heart was moved to compassion. The misery of the people around him would not allow him to keep silent. The prophet was moved to compassion because he lived close to the heart of God. Having had a first-hand experience of the loving compassion of God, the prophet was commissioned to call his hearers to deal compassionately with the poor and marginalized. Each of us is called to be a light for those who wander in darkness. Each of us is called to be a sign of hope for those who are trapped in despair. Like Christ, each of us must be willing to drink the bitter cup of suffering so that others may drink the cup of salvation.

The prophet Ezekiel spoke of the urgent demand placed on him by his calling. "Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the people of Israel; so, hear the word I speak and give them warning from me" (Ezek. 33:7). Jeremiah gave a rather graphic description of what happened when he tried to walk away from the call. "But if I say I will never mention his word or speak in his name, his word burns in my heart like a fire. It is like a fire shut up in my bones. I am utterly worn out trying to hold it in. I cannot keep silent" (Jer. 20:9). The apostle to the gentiles understood the source of this urgency. "The love of Christ compels us" (2 Cor. 5:14). The prophet's words are rooted in the heart of God. God so loved the world that he created us with a capacity to know and love him. He planted in our heart's desire to seek the truth and gave us a mission to share it with others. The Master of the Universe has called each of us by name. He wrote His Word on the tablets of our hearts. He who has spoken heart-to-heart with us has called us to speak heart-to-heart with one another. This heart-to-heart conversation will lead us to do the truth in love. As we allow God's word to echo in our hearts, we will become instruments to help others to hear the gentle voice and open their eyes to recognize God's loving presence in their lives.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

There was something of an indirect reference to the Transfiguration in this past week's memorial of Martha. The memorial also included both Mary and Lazarus. The two were added to the remembrance by Holy Father Francis some five years ago. The Feast of the Transfiguration will be celebrated Thursday of next week. In the Lukan account we read "Then from the cloud came a voice that said 'This is my chosen Son; listen to Him'". Later then in chapter 10:38 after being welcomed by Martha we appreciate 'She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at His feet (the posture of



discipleship) listening to Him speak" The significance of them listening and a fulfillment of what was spoken by the Father at the Transfiguration. Listening asks for an attentive disposition in the direction of obedience. In Latin the word 'audire' is to hear while 'agere' is to do.

The indication then as disciples is that we first hear and then do and so asking for attentive listening.

That may be an occasion to consider how well we dispose ourselves to incline our mind and hearts in keeping with what was shared at the Transfiguration. Inasmuch as Martha was busy with the work of hospitality and serving she neglected the 'better part'. Of course, in Luke, Martha was not at the Mount of Transfiguration. Still she was reminded of the choice of the 'better part'. Relative to the formation of the Gospel in our lives it may be better to consider how the busyness of our lives may preclude the better part of being continually formed in discipleship. Busy may imply that there is much to attend to and be concerned about and yet we are reminded by the celebration of the saints and particularly Mary to be attentive as those who follow Jesus with the purpose of imitation as well as lifelong learners that seek to daily cultivate and gain knowledge of what it means to live in His likeness. We recall as well Jesus's word about being anxious and worried which reverts back to the parable of the sower. Also, the reference to the "good part" also has implications of being good soil. may we too seek to be seeded in a manner of seeking growth continually in the Word made flesh.

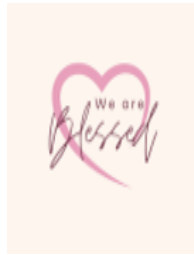

One of the wonderful things about praying the psalms is that they can be offer insight in my prayer and quiet prayer time. As I was praying Psalm 20 last week, I thought of community prayer. I thought of gathering together for Mass and my intention and the intention of the parishioners and visitors who are praying with me. I thought of all the times I asked for prayers and people ask me for prayers. That in the rhythm of the Liturgy of the Hours somewhere around the world, someone is always praying it. But I digress. I come and pray and am not sure of my thoughts and then the words and that is why I love psalm 20. Psalm 20's first line points me in a direction that I can take my prayers. "May the Lord answer in time of trial: May the name of Jacob's God protect you." Such a short line but the reminder that I know, God loves me and protects me. That protection makes me smile, because His answer to my prayer has always been extremely good and the best possible outcome, with me acknowledging that what I was specifically praying for was a specific "no but I am answering this way." His way has always been the best way! I acknowledge that somewhere around the world, I am not praying alone. I am praying in my space and so is someone else, so I am praying with a community of believers. I have prayed for specific things, towards specific people or just made the prayer for anyone who needs it. The divine intervention points me in a direction outside of myself and on a path that has the Holy Spirit leads. I am not relying on myself or anything this world may have made, I am relying on God. The line "some trust in chariots or horses" refers to trusting the things of this world more than God and those "chariots or horses" will fail. I smile because the psalm is right. The psalm points out that I can trust God over human limits and I acknowledge that every time I pray because from my experience that fact is very true. I also in a moment of reflection and reminded that it is in that trust that my faith increases and it is in living in this world and its limitations that I encounter God in the most beautiful ways. Those ways increase my faith. I choose every day to trust God to bless me and keep me safe. I encounter every day what it means to be a child of God. Perhaps sometime a petulant child but God never holds that against me. God is loving, forgiving, compassionate and merciful. Psalm 20 on Tuesday evening became highlighted on the 1 John 3:1-3 in the verse "see what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God." I am a child of God, and we are all children in faith. A faith that knows God answers prayers in the most wonderful of ways, and in praying I am following a path of believers who choose to have a relationship with him. This relationship with God, invites me to a world who also believes that he will love us, forgive us, and encourage us when we stumble to come back to Him. I am blessed with the words of the psalmist in the last line. "...O Lord, give answer on the day we call" because he always does.
