**(Acts 1: 1-11, Ephesians 1:17-23, Luke 24:46-53)**

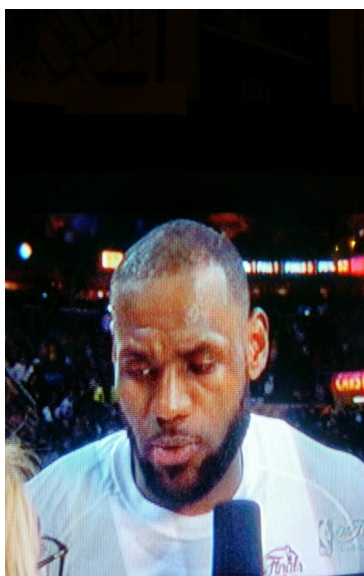
Saint Luke tells us that the Lord met with the apostles after his resurrection. Today, we witness the final encounter. The story is important because the life, teaching, death, and resurrection of Jesus made a deep impression on the Apostles. The disciples felt great comfort in his presence and quite naturally, hoped that he would stay with them forever. We have only to ponder the words spoken to Mary Magdalen in the garden, "Don't cling to me because I have to return to my Father" (CF. 20:17). Jesus makes it clear that he has to return to the Father so that his disciples could receive the Holy Spirit who will empower them to continue the upbuilding of the Heavenly Kingdom (CF. Jn. 19:7). Once they had received the Spirit, their missionary activity would embrace the whole world. Taking up the theme, Saint Paul wrote: "We who with unveiled faces can see the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into that same likeness from one degree of glory to another, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit" (2 Cor. 3:18). With Holy Mother the Church, we are filled with joy because where the Head has gone before, we, who have become members of His Body, will follow. The ascension of the Lord was not intended to be a static moment to be savored and prolonged. Whenever we have a peak experience, we want to make the moment last. Recall the words of Peter at Mount Tabor: "Lord, this is outstanding! Say the word and we can erect a shrine here" (Mat. 17:4). While we may want to stay in the heights, we have to descend into the valley where God dwells among His People. There in the expanse of the wilderness and the hectic hubbub of the marketplace, we must testify to the victory of Christ: "We proclaim that which existed from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched. He is the Word of life" (1 Jn. 1:1).

Today, Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world, ascended to the highest heavens as the angels gaze in wonder. Just as the Lord drew all men to himself as he hung on the cross, today he draws our gaze to himself as he returns to the Father. He wants us to focus our attention on our heavenly homeland where we will be coheirs with the Son who is seated at the right hand of the Father. In Christ, our human nature is elevated to heavenly glory. We need to open our hearts to receive all that he has to give us. The apostle Paul put it this way: "I press on to grasp that for which Christ Jesus has taken hold of me" (Phil. 3:12). In his narrative, Saint Luke tells us that Jesus led his disciples as far as Bethany, which was a very familiar place for them. Their trek weaved through the Kidron Valley and brought them to the eastern slope of the Mount of Olives from where they could see the home of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. Every nook and cranny brought back memories of their times with the Lord. Having refreshed their memories and touched their hearts, Jesus raised his hands and imparted his blessing upon them. With that familiar gesture, he was taken up into heaven. There is a parallel between the empty tomb and the empty hill. "Peter got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went home again, marveling at what had happened" (Lk. 24:12).

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We celebrated the liturgy this past Tuesday with the St Benedict Community. The school year is coming to a close and I learned of the countdown of 16 days remaining and a discussion about witness and (in a sense) proclamation. The first reading from Acts was about the kind of continual witness of the community post Pentecost and I spoke of the confidence of the ones who were giving testimony with (again in a sense) the odds being against them. Of course the sharing during



the homily also came around to the former Cavalier who gave witness in leading our local team to a championship. The direction of giving witness is giving testimony. How well we give evidence of our relationship with Jesus becomes more than a question but a daily challenge that we accept as members of His body. I had read much later about a question that was posed to Mr. James about

the return of two injured players that would help the team. In the news account I read that Mr. James responded 'you prepare as you prepare before.' and he added 'there's only one guy ever in the world that everything will be all right when He comes back and that's Jesus.' As was reported by one Mark Ellis, Mr. James announced his certainty in the return of Jesus. Witness and preparation for the return of Jesus may not always be forefront in our minds and hearts. Truth be told Jesus said that he would return and so we await that day. Inasmuch as the children will be on summer break they, like ourselves, will be challenged to give the kind of testimony and witness (much like ourselves) as to the presence of the Word that forms and educates us and the Eucharist that assists His presence within us until He comes again. May we be examples of those who await His return with confidence of faith to our young people as well.

On Monday as is our yearly ritual St. Martin of Tours end of year classes celebrated the closing of PSR (formerly CCD) as well as our May Crowning. As we were praying the Litany of Mary, I thought of her words in Luke 1:38 "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." I find those words powerful. Those words reach out and make me look at my life and



say "do I say and mean those same words." The reason I asked this question was that I was praying Psalm 49, and I sometimes think, this is a guy having a bad day and yet, he speaks words of faith and how this life just passes away. I also had found a passage that I use in prayer at those times. It is taken from Lamentations 3 and can make my day and carry me through. "The Lord's acts of mercy are not exhausted, his compassion is not spent;

They are renewed each morning- great is your faithfulness!" I smile because I have experienced in those bad day times, that with a pause and a prayer, I can restart my day at anytime with the direction the Spirit leads. Does it make my day good, no. What it does is give me the grace (and it's all grace) to put one step in front of the other and look to a new day, or restart a healing that maybe I have paused. It is that faith that takes me out into this world and live among it but have the knowledge and hope to say "God will bless me and get me through this." I remember the words of my Mom while walking out of the hospital after my Dad died saying "I do not know how we will get through this, but by God's grace, we will." No doubt, no fear, just the knowledge that God would bless and keep us. We prayed together because prayer quiets the chaos, and slows us down. Prayer gave us balance when we were shaky. And through it all, God was there. Together we walked a path my Mom called "offer it up to God" instead of carrying the bad day or times like a trophy. I also thought of the times, God has made my day better with someone smiling, or saying "hello", because God responds without my asking. I go back to Mary's words, may it be done according to your will, and say the same things now, knowing God's way has always been the best way. I know Mary suffered, she was at the foot of the cross, there are no words to describe that pain for me. Mary was faithful and prayerful, something I strive to be, and bad days for me point me to the grace of God and the mercy and compassion I need to get through a day. That God is all I need and bad days, they point out that my life is not deprived, it is a reminder of peace, joy and hope. That God is merciful and loving and I rejoice.
