

Continued from last week.....


Detachment from worldly possessions frees us to be at the service of others. Having nothing to give but an open hand and an open heart enables us to seek out and find those that are lost. If we allow ourselves to be consumed by the fire of divine love, we can become lights of hope to all who walk in the valley of darkness and death. Our task is not to condemn those in darkness. Our task is to be guideposts for them, pointing the way to the light. As they come into the light, they will discover the Truth that will set them free. Because God has been so gracious to us, we should be gracious to all we meet.

Christ is Risen! The empty tomb demonstrates God's judgment of the world. The barbarity of sinful mankind is overcome by God's abundant mercy and love. Christ did not come into the world to condemn it. Rather, he took our condemnation to himself and became the fount of mercy to all who would believe in him. He was stripped and in his nakedness, he clothed us in robes of righteousness. In his total self-emptying, he filled us with grace. The Lord who is risen from the dead calls us to display the riches of his mercy by seeking people who are anxious or worried that their past behaviors make them unlovable and rejected. Then, having found them, we need to show them God's loving-kindness and compassion.



FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

I understand that our sign will be returned refurbished and renewed by next week's end. Some have noticed the absence of the sign and I have been remiss in not mentioning the work that is being done to renew the brightness to the front of our property here at St. Mar-



tin's. That said we appreciate that the Easter season is also a time of continual renewal and shining forth with the presence of Jesus risen from the dead. We recall in the Gospel of Matthew that Jesus was transfigured before the eyes of Peter

and James and John. We read that His face became dazzling as the sun. A display of brightness and splendor and not without the words of the Father THIS IS MY BELOVED SON ON WHOM MY FAVOR RESTS. LIS-TEN TO HIM. The direction to attend to and obey the word made flesh. The call that we turn our minds and attention to the teachings of Jesus and seek to live up to the demands of the Gospel. Each week we are entrusted with a commission "go and announce the gospel of the Lord" or "go in peace glorifying the Lord by your life." St. Paul offers something of a challenge as we read in second Corinthians 'all of us gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces (unlike Moses) are being transformed from glory to glory into his very image by the Lord who is the Spirit. Recall as well in Matthew "You are the light of the world" with the attendant words "your light must shine before others so that they may see goodness in your acts." It would seem timely that the refurbishing of our sign can also be an opportunity to be sent forth and reflect the image of the One we ae baptized into and whose Body and Blood we share at our Eucharist. May we hear with attention the words of the Father often which again challenges us to LISTEN TO HIM. May we be free of any attitude or behavior that diminishes the light given us at baptism. Recall the prayer after the reception of our baptism with the words "that we may walk always as children of the light .. persevering in the faith and may we run to meet the Lord when he comes."

My life is a pilgrimage. A journey undertaken to a sacred spot. A journey to be draw closer to God in my life. This journey creates an intentional longing for the presence of God in my life and the next. I call it a kind of travel and not a stroll because as I get older and stiffer, movement can get difficult but does not stop the travel journey, I can do it from wherever I am. There is joy on this pilgrimage because I have experienced the privilege of not journeying alone. The more I participate the closer I am to God. God is always there, but when I forget, ignore, find other things to do, or my mind goes on a variety of tangents, I miss the presence. The presence that is always there for me. In this pilgrimage I have learned more about hope, trust, compassion, and forgiveness and restoration that comes with all of those. The nice thing about this pilgrimage is God comes to me where I am at. What started me pondering a life of pilgrimage is the two psalms in evening prayer. This past Tuesday evening, Psalm 137 reminded me how I feel when I step away from this pilgrimage and the longing while I work through resetting the course of the journey. How I felt in hard times and then tried to sing (I hum, I do not sing, it's that whole tone-deaf thing.) and felt God surrounding me in love. The peace that comes with acknowledging His presence again. Then I remember that it is God that gets me through the hard times. That I am healing in Confession, and sustained at Mass. Psalm 138 talks about saying thanks and I never say it enough. Psalm 138 in The Catholic Study Bible is titled Hymn of a Grateful Heart and I am never grateful enough. I liked the word pilgrimage this week because I am traveling with God. I did not use the word journey because while I am going from one place to another, the intention is to always do it with God. The unexpected is revealed through Him. (How when a storm rolls in, the colors of the trees, grass, and buildings all stand out to me. A reminder that God is there through this.) I spend time on this pilgrimage reflecting on how I am healed, restored and invited again to continue after a stop or detour. God loves even when I sing because he gave me the voice and that voice sounds lovely to Him. Pilgrimages even from my couch are not always easy, I have to take the time to acknowledge, God is there. Then I have to actually listen then do what is asked. I have found that what God asks of me to do is always right, so why I do not always just do what is asked is beyond me. Those things become the detour but eventually I get back to the pilgrimage. It is in the pilgrimage that I see and experience the blessings and grace of God. It is in the pilgrimage that I find the strength and healing to get through. In the pilgrimage I have found hope, faith and love. I experience God.


