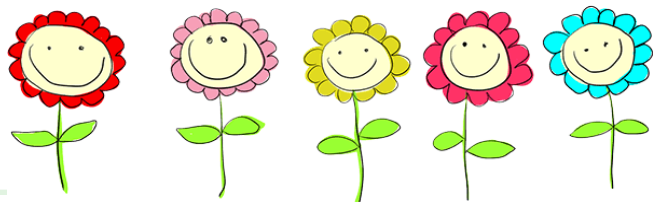

"It was the LORD who sent me to prophesy against this house and city all that you have heard" (Jer. 26:12). The prophet does not speak on his own authority. This is confirmed in a comment made by the prophet Amos. "I was not a prophet, and I was never trained as one. I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore trees. It was the Lord who took me from following the flock and sent me to preach to his people Israel" (Am. 7:14-15). God not only called the prophet, but he also put a huge burden on him, the need to speak a message that would bring salvation to the people. God allowed the prophet to see what he saw. God opened his heart to the prophet and allowed him to feel the agony of suffering humanity in all its horror. The prophetic utterance is the voice that God lends to the silent agony of the poor. God reveals his compassionate love through the empathic words of the prophet. God's compassionate love for the poor and needy was, and remains, a challenge to the rich. The word of the Lord is rooted in compassion, not compromise. The prophet speaks of justice and mercy. Living among the people, the prophet's heart was moved to compassion. The misery of the people around him would not allow him to keep silent. The prophet was moved to compassion because he lived close to the heart of God. Having had a first-hand experience of the loving compassion of God, the prophet was commissioned to call his hearers to deal compassionately with the poor and marginalized. Each of us is called to be a light for those who wander in darkness. Each of us is called to be a sign of hope for those who are trapped in despair. Like Christ, each of us must be willing to drink the bitter cup of suffering so that others may drink the cup of salvation.

The prophet Ezekiel spoke of the urgent demand placed on him by his calling. "Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the people of Israel; so, hear the word I speak and give them warning from me" (Ezek. 33:7). Jeremiah gave a rather graphic description of what happened when he tried to walk away from the call. "But if I say I will never mention his word or speak in his name, his word burns in my heart like a fire. It is like a fire shut up in my bones. I am utterly worn out trying to hold it in. I cannot keep silent" (Jer. 20:9). The apostle to the gentiles understood the source of this urgency. "The love of Christ compels us" (2 Cor. 5:14). The prophet's words are rooted in the heart of God. God so loved the world that he created us with a capacity to know and love him. He planted in our heart's desire to seek the truth and gave us a mission to share it with others. The Master of the Universe has called each of us by name. He wrote His Word on the tablets of our hearts. He who has spoken heart-to-heart with us has called us to speak heart-to-heart with one another. This heart-to-heart conversation will lead us to do the truth in love. As we allow God's word to echo in our hearts, we will become instruments to help others to hear the gentle voice and open their eyes to recognize God's loving presence in their lives.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What came to mind last Wednesday as we celebrated Mary Magdalene was the work of the sculptor Michelangelo. While in Florence with my Mom some years back we visited two galleries. The David being one along with the incomplete statues of the four prisoners intended for the tomb of Pope Julius II that were incomplete and were waiting to be revealed in the creative process of sculpting. (I also had the thought that we are in the process of being shaped as well as we seek to reveal the presence of the Lord in our day to day. The question becomes



(as we are unfinished so to speak) are we being fashioned and formed into the likeness of Jesus? The figures were close to the David there at the Accademia which depicts the ideals of beauty and strength at the time of the Renaissance. The idea of continual formation had me considering the Florentine pieta. (There is another in Milan as well.) Different from the Pieta in Rome there are included not only Our Blessed Mother but also two figures assisting in the deposition. (I keep a photo of the sculpture in my work space). Michelangelo begun the sculpture in his early 70's. The sculpture was inclusive of the figures of Mary Magdalene as well as a cowed figure that some would say was Nicodemus while others consider Joseph of Arimathea. Looking closely the figure has the features of Michelangelo himself. Some offered that what he was attempting to demonstrate "a yearning of an old man for oneness of God". How many of us consider how we too desire the same kind of yearning for deeper union with Jesus? The sculpture may prompt a question of our desire for deeper union with Jesus. Mary Magdalene was present for the passion and death and the experience of the empty tomb and so the resurrection. The Apostle to the Apostles we read as she was missioned. How might we place ourselves in the context or the setting of the four seeking to be shaped and our desire for deeper union with Jesus? In a poem by Michelangelo we read 'Of death I am sure, but not of the time. Life is short and little remains before me; My senses are deleted, however I am bound for Heaven, and she prays that I go'.

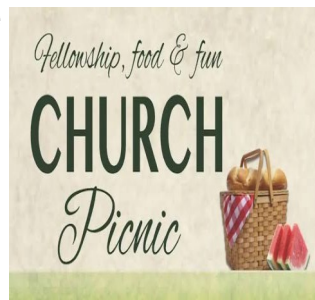
*Hear, O Lord, the sound of my call; have pity on me,

There is a rhythm in my life of the Liturgy of the Hours that I love. It is the rhythm of prayer, a movement of grace. It provides a practical blue print for my life. On Wednesday I came to work to participate in a Zoom call on the new computer software that everyone in the office has to learn to publish the bulletin. I am not lying when I say I was nervous. After a few minutes into the call I realized, I know this. I can do this. Then the thought occurred to me, you have seen this before and there are familiar parts to it. I just have to learn the unfamiliar parts. In the movement of grace my life, the familiar parts are my time in prayer and the unfamiliar parts of this life that makes me desire another life. The blue print is first to let the Holy Spirit lead. I should follow his direction and let him rule my decisions. I am not always good at trying not to control the situation but the peace I find in my prayer time when I present myself, as I am, with all my flaws, not to mention anxiety, I know that I am loved and am not going to be let astray. I live in this world but the path I choose to walk, the rhythm of my day, is Christ centered and with the Holy Spirit (who has learned over time that ball bat techniques work best on me) keeping me on this path, I find I walk in peace in the most horrendous of times. The Liturgy of the Hours and more especially attending Mass, lets the words of Christ "saturate" my mind. I say my mind, because my heart wants this but my mind leads me astray. I just recently found the word "saturate" and the definition online is "cause (something) to become thoroughly soaked with liquid so that no more can be absorbed." If I substitute the Word of God with liquid and it is soaked into my mind so that my mind quits absorbing the world's contradictions, would not that make following God easier? Would that not allow contradictions to be seen more and following the Spirit easier. (Let you all know if I find a better word.) I really do not need words about the love of God and the relationship we have because really, none describe it. But as I get older, I find that the prayers that have always been there, with the words I have always said, start to have a deeper meaning and it is in that meaning and my acknowledgement of them, that I grow in faith. It is in that faith, that I can surmount the noise of life and find the peace of God. Another part of this rhythm that I found over time is gratitude. I am grateful to God who has transformed my life. That transformation keeps me on the path of the Gospel message. That transformation allows me to see God, who in the worst moments of my life, says "I am here." It took me some time to find this rhythm and I am still working on it. It has taken 68 years for me to try to saturate my mind, so that it can see the inconsistencies of this world, and become aligned with my heart. I learned that in letting Christ rule me, my whole self, heart and mind, that there is peace, joy and love. I love this rhythm..

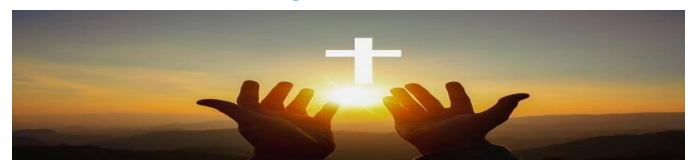
