(Isaiah 52: 13 – 53:12, Hebrews 4: 14–16, 5: 7–9, John 18: 1 – 19:42)  
Good Friday is a day of faith, hope, and love. Today's liturgy allows us to contemplate Jesus, the Paschal Victim, and to deepen our love of Him who willingly laid down his life for love of us. We need this day to help us become more mindful of the fact that we have been redeemed and that good does overcome evil. Our war-torn world needs someone willing to take its pain and suffering upon his shoulders and offer it to the Father as a sacrifice of praise, healing, and reconciliation. Jesus' love transforms suffering into an acceptable sacrifice to his heavenly Father and fills our aimless wandering with meaning, purpose, and direction. We praise and bless the one who is the source of our salvation.

The reading from the prophet Isaiah presents us with the image of the suffering servant. The Christian community has traditionally applied this image to the person of Christ. The early church used this passage to help it deal with the scandal of Jesus's rejection, passion, and death. Because he willingly emptied himself, accepting death on the cross, God the Father raised him up in glory, made him the source of blessing, and subjected all of creation to him. Today's society seems to embody what was described in the Book of Psalms: "Scorn has broken my heart and has left me helpless; I looked for sympathy, but there was none, for comforters, but I found none" (Ps. 69:20). Even though the cross is presented to us, and the death of the Beloved Son of God is declared to us, it is sad to say that many people do not notice it. Our hearts have become so callous that we have no sympathy for people enduring pain and suffering around us. Let us look at the cross and offer comfort to the righteous One who endured untold sufferings to make us whole.

"Behold, my servant shall prosper, he shall be raised high and greatly exalted" (Is. 52:13). God's words concerning the suffering servant are reminiscent of those spoken on Mount Tabor. "This is my dearly beloved son, whom I love; in whom I take great delight" (Mat. 3:17). Because the Son willingly submitted to death on the cross, thereby making his death a free-will offering for the sins of the world, the Father highly exalted him. "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and because of his wounds we are healed" (Isa. 53:5). When the heart of Christ was pierced our hearts were torn open and given the ability to feel compassion again. In preaching Christ crucified, the church lays bare our guilt and announces our redemption.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Easter (or Easter day) has some connection with the word 'dawn' (growing light in the morning) as well 'east' and so a direction towards sun rise. St. Bede wrote that we adopted the word for the Mass of Resurrection. Easter and the celebration following our Lenten observance and hopefully a time in which we have grown in the light and knowledge of our relationship with the Risen Christ. At the vigil we relight candles as those who reaffirm our baptismal relationship with Jesus. Lent is also a



period in which we strengthen our relationship with the Word made Flesh. The suffering Servant passages in Isaiah "The Lord God has given me a learned tongue, so that I would know how to uphold with a word... he wakens my ear to hear as disciples do." One approach might see Jesus as the suffering servant who (with a learned tongue) might teach those who are His disciples. In the Gospel of Matthew there is a distinction between the responses of the disciples as the twelve at the Passover meal call Jesus 'Lord' while Judas addresses Him as Rabbi. The response 'Lord' implies a submission to authority. That would be an acknowledgement that one is a servant in the relationship. The address 'Rabbi' can be noncommittal. In the text Jesus is the teacher (well-trained tongue) and Judas' response doesn't imply that he is willing to learn from Him. Perhaps it is something to consider as those renewing our baptismal relationship. Am I/are we intent on cultivating and learning and thinking about a direction of life that is fixed upon His Way and Life and Truth. In the course of our lives we hear the words of consecration and digest the Body and Blood of Jesus. How well do we assimilate in our minds and hearts the bread of life and the wine of salvation inclusive of His teaching? His instruction of 'love one another as I love you' as well as in John 13:15 'I have given you a model to follow, so that what I have done for you should also do.' May we integrate well the teachings of the Word made Flesh. May the season of Easter be a renewal in the direction of following Jesus.

Every year during Holy Week I approach the empty tomb. I am always in awe of the fact that Jesus is risen. The empty tomb always asks me "do you believe?" and I always answer "I do." My faith requires that I believe but it is the change of heart I experience every year and continue to do so that makes Easter so fulfilling for me. It asks me to reform as in attitudes and behavior, to remember and be a part of the journey. The journey asks, is Jesus alive in me and what does that mean in "my thoughts and in my words in what I have done and what I have failed to do." (attitudes and behavior) I am asked to be a disciple on the journey, to continually change my heart in the direction of the footsteps of Jesus Christ. These thoughts make me smile because in my life lately I got comfortable with how I walk and carry myself. Earlier last week I noticed that my back hurt a little more than usual and ignored it until Palm Sunday night when the pain let me know in a big way, I had been doing something wrong. I had ceased to watch how I was walking. Not straight, not looking up, but hunched and looking down. In short, not participating in movements forward that require a posture and stance that would totally support a straight back. I was told to find my cane, but not use it for support, but to make myself aware of my posture and how I put one-foot in front of the other.

It worked. Then in PSR at the end of class I shared that this was a reminder to me of what Holy Week into Easter meant to me. It asked me to reestablish those things in my life that I slowly ignored as a disciple that I remembered. That I have to totally immerse myself in this journey, this path so that I can be the disciple of Christ that sees joy in the empty tomb. That there is life and light and I did not fully appreciate it, notice or walk this path I desire to walk but got comfortable with not doing even though, like the apostles on the road to Emmaus, my heart was burning, I did not recognize Christ. It was a happy but painful reminder that Easter's empty tomb is not once a year but every day. That I need Christ alive in me for others to see. The empty tomb reminds me that Christ is the way out of sin and darkness to a light that brings peace. It is a journey that I need to walk every year as a reminder of what I believe and how to walk as to see the light of Christ and spread it. That I choose to walk this path and must do it straight and going forward and in doing so I find peace and love. I am a child of God and Easter is a reminder that Jesus has risen and this is the journey I have chosen and I always need his assistance in doing so.
