Light on the Liturgy

<u>2nd Sunday of Lent: United to Christ, the World's</u> Salvation

We the adopted children of God; we are God's Chosen People of the New Covenant and members of the Body of Christ. All of this is possible because, through Baptism, we have been joined to Christ in his dying, rising and glorification at the Father's right hand. We have a personal, intimate relationship with Christ, our Lord and brother. Through him, we have the same personal, intimate relationship with God our Father and with the Holy Spirit, our life and inspiration – the relationship that God intended at creation, the relationship that makes us children of God. Jesus has reconciled us to the God who created us.

Our relationship with Christ also unites us with one another as the Body of Christ in a community called Church (*ecclesia*: assembly), commissioned to continue the work of Christ, building the Reign of God, proclaiming the Good News that God's love has overcome the power of sin and evil and has made it possible for us to overcome these tendencies toward sin in our own lives. In this way, we not only demonstrate that sin and evil can be overcome, but we also allow God's love for all people to shine through our lives. It is valid to say that God depends on us to let the world know who God really is.

What this all tells us is that we are saved, redeemed, and made who we are by our relationship with Christ and, through him, with the Trinity - whose very life is a continuous act of love. We are not a people of the Law; St. Paul makes this clear (Rom 6/14; Gal. 3/23-29). We are a people of grace, saved not by what we do, but by the gracious love of God. This does not mean that we are free to do whatever we want. We are a people of "the rule of law." Laws and rules are necessary for the good ordering of society. Laws, especially the New Law proclaimed by Jesus (Mt., chaps. 5 - 7), are meant to guide us to live according to God's Way. However, we Christians witness to God's Way, not by trying to force others to believe and live as we are called to live. Christians have tried that before, and it has always failed (recall the *Inquisition*). We witness to, and proclaim, God's Way by loving God and one another, following the example and teachings of Jesus. (cont. next week)

FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

I had the opportunity to visit Seton Hall University, in the past, for a week of theological updating. An impressive group of educators and scholars. Joseph Fitzmyer being one and George



Aschenbrenner another. The first biblical and the other in spirituality. I must say they were both challenging and enlightening. There was a line from the Gospel of Luke that we were to consider. That would be Luke 5:8 where Peter was astonished at the catch of fish and fell at the feet of Jesus (prior to this he had addressed Jesus as Master (teacher)) while here, he said DEPART FROM ME LORD, I AM A SINFUL MAN. Not aware of the association with the Prophet

Isaiah I had the thought that Peter was looking to avoid discipleship in relationship to Jesus. I was corrected, as in Isaiah who expressed that he was a man of unclean lips. What followed both encounters was the direction of being missioned. It would seem that the season of Lent is a time to consider our own relationship to being discipled and missioned. As we celebrated the Chair of Peter this past week I became aware of how Peter himself fell short in the way of discipleship and what comes to mind is his threefold denial after the arrest of Jesus. The charcoal fire comes to mind as he was warming himself. What also comes to mind is the charcoal fire that Jesus used to prepare a meal in John's gospel where Peter confessed his love for Jesus three times as well. From what I gathered in reading for the morning there was one commentator who spoke of Peter being rehabilitated. He was restored to right relationship, in a manner of speaking, and was given the direction of feeding and tending and feeding the sheep. There is a quote from Alice Walker that I keep on my desk. It reads "anything they truly love can be saved, first in their own hearts, and then in the hearts of others. They have only to make their love inseparable from their belief and both inseparable from hard work." It begins with each of us to be conscious of where rehabilitation needs to happen in our own lives. Lent is a season of restoration and reform where we seek to be repaired and renewed and free from the residuals of sin. How well then do we need to appreciate the kind of dwelling place we are by virtue of our own baptismal identity. As we anticipate the renewal of our baptismal vows in the coming weeks may we be more conscious (Aschenbrenner here) and so avail ourselves of the opportunity to consider our love for Christ and His for ourselves. Despite our sinful inclinations may we seek to be restored in his Way and Truth and Life. With the psalmist may we "wake at dawn to praise our Lord" with our minds and hearts and lips.

On Ash Wednesday I noticed the new banner on the Ambo. It reads "BY HIS STRIPES WE ARE HEALED." The banner has been a source of meditation, just swirling around and my heart said "I noticed." I appreciated it was from Isaiah 53, so I went and researched the text. It is part of the Suffering Servant and a messianic prophecy about the One who was to come. This part of the prophecy presents and reflects as to Jesus's suffering. The banner quotes the last line of verse 5. "But he was pierced for our sins, crushed for our iniquity. He bore the punishment that makes us whole, by his wounds we were healed." The punishment that makes us whole. Another line that just swirled around between heart and head saying "did you notice the two of them together?" I love Lent, it gives me things to consider about my relationship with God and while some of those things can be pointed in a direction that I am not going in, always in hope. The hope because I think of piercing that my sins can cause and how about fatigue that leads to poor choices of word and actions that I have done to others and to God. That by His stripes I am healed in confession, in the Eucharist in my transgressions. I know that every Sunday as I prepare for Mass, I admit through the penitential act that I am a sinner and I love it even more when as the liturgy is planned with the Confiteor, the penitential rite when I acknowledge to both God and the people in the pews that I am maybe not that servant of Christ that I say I am. My actions have consequences and maybe sometimes not good one(s) due to unfortunate actions. The prayer at the end of the Penitential Rite is: "May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins and bring us to everlasting life." Then, except during Advent and Lent, we go straight into the Gloria. I find it healing that I bring my stripes with me when I come and find forgiveness, experience the transformation of bread to His body and wine to His blood. That I am healed, sustained for the journey out the doors of the church. That what I have received, what those stripes have given me is healing. I experience hope, healing, strength, peace and love in Father's prayer: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." My word "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." Then I receive communion and have Jesus's body, Jesus's blood within me. Changing me and healing me. By those stripes I hopefully acknowledge that I am changed, my relationship with God is restored and rejuvenated. These thoughts bring hope, that in my relationship with God, I can be in His image, following Jesus's path to eternal light. The new banner is a wonderful reminder during Lent for me to become aware again about the many prayers at Mass, my participation should not be just words but through the lens: BY HIS STRIPES WE ARE HEALED.
