Daniel 12: 1-3 Hebrews 10: 11-14, 18

Mark 13:24-32

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (Mk. 13: 31). As the liturgical year comes to an end, the readings direct our attention towards the end times. Confronted with the fact that the world as we know it is passing away, we can take comfort in the knowledge that God's Word to us is not. In today's gospel passage, the Lord Jesus is speaking a word of encouragement and consolation to his disciples fully aware of the challenges that lay before them. At no time does Christ promise to remove the struggles we must face, but, he does promise to be with us all the days of our lives. It would be good to recall Saint Paul's words to the church of Rome. "If God is with us, who can be against us?" (Rom. 8:31) God uses all the trials that we have to bear as means of conforming us to the image of his Son. I find great consolation in the knowledge that no matter what we have to endure, God can use it for our good (CF. Rom. 8:28).

"But the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever" (Dan. 12:3). God, the Creator of the Universe, uses our hands and feet to further his creative plans. He reveals his kingdom of God through our actions. The Kingdom is not dependent on fancily crafted speeches. Rather, it depends on honest and intimate relationships. Remember Jesus's words. "Everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love and unselfish concern for one another" (Jn. 13:35). Love is not a noun. Love is a verb, an action. Talk is cheap. "Don't tell me; show me" (Marion Berkoe). We love because we are loved. Even if our acts of love are rejected, we continue to love because love is stronger than death (CF. Song 8:6). Love will demand all you have to give because it is signed and sealed with the blood of Christ.

The world is flawed and broken but denies it. People want to be healed but refuse to look in the mirror of truth to find the nature of their malady. As Jesus said, "You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (Jn. 8:32). Only those who gaze upon the glory of God shining on the face of Christ (CF. 2 Cor.4:6) can acknowledge their weakness and find peace and lasting joy. Those who have come to know this joy and peace are empowered to share it with others. Recall the words of Peter to the lame man at the temple gate. "What I have, I give you" (Acts 3:6). One who has come to know the love of God can speak the truth in love. Having come to know oneself as a beloved child of God is free to recognize every person as a gift from God and treat them with love and respect. G.K. Chesterton quipped, "Angels can fly because they take themselves lightly" (Orthodoxy).

FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

The word "resistance" came to mind this past week. We may add that it would seem that the prophet Jonah had issues with the people of Nineveh. Perhaps a negative view of the population there and so was opposed to following the direction of God. In the priest's residence I keep a large reproduction of the prophet that I photographed some years back when visiting Rome. It is a



depiction of the prophet by Michelangelo on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel. As read in the Book of Jonah he was reluctant to be missioned to the people of Nineveh. After spending time in the belly of a large fish he is missioned again. I discussed with the children at the School Mass at St. Benedict that Jonah was restored after three days and three nights inside the fish.

I alluded to the Triduum and how the number three prefigured Jesus 's resurrection. In the Sistine Chapel Jesus is depicted just below Jonah. One of the takeaways from reading the prophet was that we too are missioned to be messengers of the good news. At the same time, we may have some resistance to bearing the message or communicating to those we encounter what it means to be sent as disciples of Jesus. Inasmuch as Jonah became angry at the end of the encounter he was reminded that God was merciful to those who repent. Jonah lacked compassion and forgiveness and felt (perhaps) that the people of Nineveh were undeserving of mercy and forgiveness. The guestion for ourselves may become one that asks how reluctant am I or are we to forgive as Jesus forgives? Do we struggle against the words we pray 'FORGIVE US OUR SINS AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO SIN AGAINST US? Are we willing to appreciate some kind of disconnect and once acknowledged then seek to be faithful to the words we offer each time we celebrate the Eucharist. I mentioned during the week that there will be a convocation for priests about the church's mission in a polarized world. That would seem apt as we sense daily different divisions in our modern-day world. At the same time, we are missioned to seek to draw others to the experience of Jesus by our presence among them. We are sent and dispatched and perhaps need to appreciate a consciousness of HIS presence that we have within us to be aware of what it is be agents of peace and reconciliation and free of the kind of anger that separates and divides. May we be conscious of prejudgments that they may fall to fact. May we in fact seek to share that which Jesus may encourage in the manner of peace and perseverance in His way and life.

From Bobbi Bugaj

This past week was fast paced. I was doing things unexpected and definitely things that we not on my pre-planned to do list. There was shifting of priorities, places I was supposed to be that I would never get to and a type of absolute uncertainty at any changing moment. As Bob and I were walking out the door knowing that there would be some waiting we both grabbed rosaries. At one point in the hurry up and wait situations I thought of the words to Amazing Grace by John Newton. I thought of the first line "Amazing Grace how sweet the sound" because in a world of constant changing and busy noise grace has a quiet sound. The sound that lets you catch your breath breaking the bonds of noise and worry and lets you find peace and healing not always in silence because the world is very seldom silent but in the quiet of a heart that says "God is near." As I pulled out the rosary to pray I had choices of light, sorrow, joyful and glory. I would start with the one for the day and move on. By Tuesday which was Our Lady of the Rosary I was appreciating in a different way the power of the Rosary and prayer. I thought about Mary's yes and how it is one of the joyful mysteries and how Mary's cooperation with God's plan is the heart that I want to follow. I want that model of faith and obedience to be so ingrained in my heart, my actions and words, that it comes naturally. I want my heart to change so that the Faith, the trust and the total submission to God is automatic. I know that her world was not easy and as I contemplate the Sorrowful Mysteries I think of Luke 2:19 "And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." I know that this line comes at the birth of Jesus, but I like to think that she kept all in her heart, Jesus's life, death, resurrection, ascension and his coming again. I have a not so small but no large statute of Mary in my home, of Mary holding Jesus in her arms as a child. As I was saying the rosary again the worlds to Amazing Grace came back to me. "The Lord has promised Good to me, his word my hope secures, He will my shield and portion be, as long as life endures." Mary's "yes", her choice to allow faith and trust to guide in an unknown and noisy world, to keep the joy, sorrow, glorious, and light in her heart, never to guestion just obey is the faith and trust I work towards. To leave the noise in the world and acknowledge the grace, mercy, healing and rejuvenation that comes when I follow and not question. It is this pilgrims' path that changes the essence of my heart, making me find quiet in a noisy world so that I can acknowledge again what the noise tries to drown out, God is there, God is leading, God is loving, I just need to stop the questions, and follow in faith. When God asks the question to me, "are you prepared to do this?" I want my answer to always be yes.
