

**Isaiah 30: 19-21, 23-26,
Matthew 9:35- 10:1, 5a, 6-8**

A few moments ago, we heard these wonderful words from the prophet Isaiah: “[The Lord] will be gracious to you when you cry out, as soon as he hears he will answer you” (Is. 30: 19). The time of darkness and gloom is ended. The people have seen a great light. Their groans are replaced with songs of joy and their tears with laughter. Saint Paul was correct when he wrote, “The world in its present form is passing away” (1 Cor. 7:31). During the season of Advent, we are



preparing for the coming of the Lord of Light. The one who conquered death and darkness will return to take us into his kingdom of light. We have only to look towards the East and watch for the coming of the dawn. As the deer thirsts for running water, we thirst for the Living God. As people hunger for bread, we hunger for the Bread of Life.

The Master of the Harvest has planted the seed of the gospel in our hearts. The Ruler of All, the Only-begotten and Beloved Son of God has taken flesh in the womb of the ever-virgin Mary. During these days of Advent, we are reminded of how Christ laid aside his divine privileges and took to himself our limited mortal nature so that we might be clothed in his divinity. God so loved us that he sent his Son into our flawed and sinful world. He became poor to make us rich. He became weak to make us strong. He did for us what we could not do for ourselves. By his self-emptying, He reconciled us with his Father. The gift we have received surpasses any gift we could give someone else.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Depending on one's viewing habits there is the seeming reality of targeting a particular audience. The hoped for response is to participate in the purchase or use of that which is being advertised and broadcast. I am not sure how much of what is being 'hawked' so to speak which comes from the German 'to sell in the open or peddle with the term hawker meaning an itinerant vendor. At times there may be a celebrity who may testify to the value and usefulness of a certain product. Other times, simply ordinary people who may attest to the value and usefulness of that which is being (in a sense) solicited and



attractive to buy or to gift. I understand too that the folks at Playhouse Square will be offering the Grinch tale about stealing Christmas. All that said, I was reminded that the early darkness we are experiencing presently will give way to longer day light and the shortening of the day light hours will become reversed. At Seton Hall University, one summer, it was explained to me that there is a certain amount of obfuscation

in the world today relative to religious practice. (I had to look it up for to obfuscate is to darken or obscure and confuse). That might ask for a direction of seeing the gift of the birth of Jesus as an opportunity to renew our own commitment to the light of the world and unwrap and reveal and disclose the meaning of that gift by living in likeness. Not that we would be on an advertising channel but how might we make manifest to others our being attentive to the way and truth and the life given us by Jesus. Jesus's own itinerary through various towns and villages and areas (inclusive of Samaria) was to make present the Kingdom of God. How might I/we continue to make present the elements of the Kingdom? Some of which are peace and joy and hope and sharing the message of the Kingdom. Often, we pray THY KINGDOM COME THY WILL BE DONE ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN. May we be continually challenged to what it is to live in the light and knowledge of Jesus. May we, as well, be examples of those who disclose and reveal the great gift of His birth.

I love Advent. I love the start of the Liturgical New Year and it I love the words "Prepare the way of the Lord." I can look back and Jesus's first coming to this world as an infant. It brings a longing and the desire to change my heart, to follow a path, walk a journey that leads to everlasting life and the alert to His second coming. The desire brings hope and joy. Tuesday night on this first week of advent the reading was 1 Corinthians 1:4-9, it starts out "I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus....". Mass started with O Come O Come Emmanuel and the Gospel of Luke ended with "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see. For I say to you, many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it." I felt that I was reminded that I need to see any of my dysfunction, I am invited to remember a coming and given an invitation to prepare myself differently, to call Emmanuel and change with the reminder that I am being given a free gift and a path, the opportunity to see how to change if I so open my heart. The grace has come and the path I follow is where Jesus walked and leads me. My desire to change has me giving thanks and gratitude that even when I stumble, I can get up, be forgiven and start again. The Holy Spirit guides and I acknowledge all is grace and the longing and desire is increased. I spend time in prayer and I have smiled a lot over a couple of days because I started this week with a renewed invitation from St. Paul that it is time once again to start dusting out cobwebs and acknowledge the Grace of God. "Bestowed" is defined as "confer or present (an honor, right or gift) and the gift of grace is the greatest gift ever. It is given in the love of God for all of us and I can feel it every day. In O Come O Come Emmanuel the refrain says Emmanuel shall come. He did and he will come again, in the meantime he lives in my heart, he guides me on a path that keeps me with him. I am asked to prepare again, to look at times that I may have departed and come back. To review, rejuvenate, be restored and rejoice. The Gospel of Luke reminds me that I have eyes that see and ears that hear. Am I using them? Do I remember and acknowledge the past with the coming of Jesus? Do I willingly participate so as to see the world with the eyes and ears of Jesus? Does this change my heart? But what I do know is that it makes the longing, the desire and the strength to follow greater. It does change my heart. I realized that even with my flaws I am blessed, I have it all.
