FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My first pastor was (as I have mentioned in the past) a restorer as well as a builder of clocks. This I was told, assisted not only a kind of hobby, but a pursuit that was recommended along with certain dietary restrictions (including salt free bread) to encourage good health. Time (so to speak) to engage in an activity that was focused as well as



productive. Inasmuch as we are coming upon what is understood be daylight saving time we are, in a manner of speaking, springing forward. In the early Christian calendar (12 century so noted) the period of Lent came from the old English "Lencten" which meant springtime and so the idea of lengthening of days and so more

daylight. The concept of springing forward this weekend may have deeper implications for ourselves as well. My first pastor would spend the evening before the change by adjusting the clocks in the residence. There were many. Adjustments are about being in conformity and adapting not so much to a purpose but to a person in our movement through this Lenten season. A sacred time to reflect on and consider (perhaps) 'springing time' when plants begin to rise and trees to bud. I noticed near the residence the budding of green and the beginning of the growth of daffodils. Early spring flowers from bulbs once planted. With that in mind what was sown within us (as we recall in Matthew 13) is the word of God. That may suggest (for some of us) to prepare the soil of our lives in keeping with the growth and development of the gospel life. In a word the practical imitation of Jesus Himself. For many there may need to be considered how well we seek to live in conformity and so be shaped and fashioned to bear the image and likeness of Jesus. In the coming weeks more plants will begin to rise and trees will begin to bud. We too can be budding presences and may use the 'spring forward' time to be mindful of our vocation to grow and develop in relationship to the person of Jesus. Some have commented that we will lose an hour of sleep and so be prepared for the time change. I think back to Matthew chapter 26 as Jesus was in the garden and said to Peter and James and John REMAIN HERE AND KEEP WATCH WITH ME. We recall that not once but three times when he returned he found them asleep, this before his betrayal and some would say that they were in the dark about what was to occur. Inasmuch as we prepare for the time change we may use the remaining time of Lent to prepare to welcome Christ our Light as we appreciate what was the result of His passion and death and resurrection. May we share then in appreciation and the kind of thoughtfulness that asks for adjustments with the seeds of the gospel sown in us.

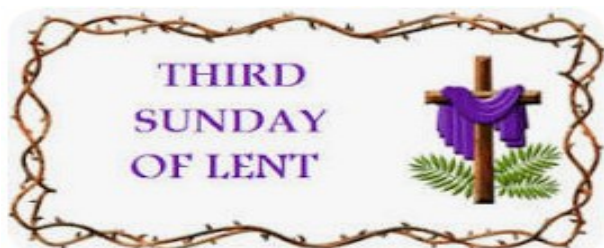

Continued from last weeks Bulletin....

Closer to home - this might appear as a self-revelation - I'm sure some of my brethren will have comments. There is the homilist who primes the pump to get praise "did I speak slowly enough or loud enough?" - a loaded question—but who really is looking for "Father, that was the best homily I ever heard, can I have a copy?" The good father responds, "Sure, I just happen to have a hundred copies in my pocket!" The cook who makes a good meal and expects applause, demands for the recipe. The person who does an act of kindness, whatever it may be, and is extremely disappointed with the lack of response or not lavish enough. You can use your imagination and add to these. Temptation, however it comes, is not a respecter of persons. Holiness, dignity, and position are not "untemptable". Jesus, our Lord and Teacher, was tempted by absolute evil and He met it eye to eye. In His sacred humanity, after 40 days of solitude, of fasting He was vulnerable. I believe I can say that because He was like us in all things but sin, He felt the attraction, the power but He fought it with a greater weapon, the power of God's own words. "It is written, It is written, It is written...!" Evil is a slow learner and slow in conceding. So if we find ourselves being tempted to unbelief or disbelief, tempted to infidelity in marriage, to monastic vows, tempted to greediness, selfishness, to dishonesty, deceit - the temptation is not a sin, only a movement to that - it becomes sin we say yes to it and act upon it. In our faith life we need to be vigilant of what is happening in our minds. Thoughts do matter and matter a lot. It is most important that we recognize temptation for what it offers an act of rebellion against God, against others, against our own nature as children Of God, His beloved. Temptation proclaims: "Grace, love, goodness do not matter, they can be dispensed with and sadly, are. Jesus had no time for the evil one or his lies. He shouted, "Get away, Satan!" In that loud, serious command, Our Lord tells us how to face any temptation; He gives us His own power, nothing less. Whatever the temptation, we need not face it alone. Jesus did say, "I am with you."

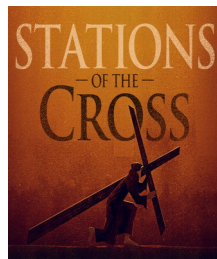

Last Tuesday was a very busy day, manageable just non-stop busy. I finally arrived at the point where I could think about evening prayer and thinking to myself: "what do the readings say to me and what do I derive out of this day?" Two things unrelated came to mind. Psalm 49 repeats "in his riches, man lacks wisdom: he is like the beasts that are destroyed." My first thought was okay, what is the message of my day. I thought of the word "riches" and what are riches to me? Knowing that sometimes idols slip into my life when I get distracted, I thought of the day in full. Working to stay caught up in the many things that happen in my day. I had an appointment to get to. It seems that my car caught a case of the e-check flu and the check engine light came on and it did not pass the test. It needed to go to see a mechanic. I came back and continued the day heading into evening prayer and Mass. My day is full of riches, I drink coffee with my husband Bob in the morning, I love my job and the people I work with. So what becomes a riches that would distract from the wisdom of God? Well, my fragile ego for one. I am a rule keeper and follower. I love rules and there is no room for grey area, but I experienced many times in my life, that forgiveness, compassion and mercy are very much in the grey areas of my life. They are what I trip over when I try to separate on polar ends what is actual riches and what is a distraction that makes brass look like gold. I am pondering almsgiving in two ways, to be a little more generous to those charities that help the poor and by giving a little more of myself to the acknowledgement that I am a part of the world that I live in and so is everyone else. How do I make that happen? My acknowledging everyone I meet. Holding a door, saying Hi in a line of people, helping someone when they seem confused. Then there is helping family and friends. Acknowledging that they have problems too. I am not looking to tear the person of Bobbi down and start again. I like her and maybe I just need to be fine tuned. I get a little bit more reflective during Lent about perceived short comings but I know that becoming the image of God is one step at a time. That I do one corrected action or thought and try not to pick up another distracted action or thought. Does it work? Mostly, but my favorite thing about Lent is how it changes my life by showing what forgiveness, compassion, mercy mean to me and how I learn how much God loves me and cares for me. This past Tuesday was a day of love, maybe a long day, an exhausting day, but a day of love. God's love is why I can see and experience God everywhere and in everyone. That love goes out of me, and what I receive in return makes the reflection and changes desirable and not hard to try to do. [I love lent.](#)
