Acts 17: 15, 22-18:1., John 16:12-15

"As I walked around looking carefully at your shrines, I even discovered an altar inscribed: To an Unknown God." This comment made me think about the present-day phenomenon of people identifying themselves as spiritual but not religious. Like the Athenians, they are looking for something, but don't have a name for it. This drive to find a higher power echoes a famous passage from St. Augustine's Confessions: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord and our heart is restless until it rests in you." Even though some people have drifted from organized religion, something inside them keeps drawing them to find this unnamable thing just beyond their grasp. This search for the "unknown" is at the core of the human heart.

The council fathers, addressing the longings of the human heart wrote: "The truth is that only in the mystery of the incarnate Word does the mystery of man take on light. For Adam, the first man, was a figure of Him Who was to come, namely Christ the Lord. Christ, the final Adam, by the revelation of the mystery of the Father and His love, fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear" (Gaudium Et Spes, #22). We will never search alone because He who is the image of the invisible God (CF. Col. 1:15) has entered into our world to be our guide to the Father. Because God's love for us addresses the deepest longings of our hearts it surpasses anything we can hope or imagine. Is it any wonder that some people find formal religion a hindrance to their encounter with the living God? Because God is infinite, should we be surprised that we have difficulty putting our experience into words? Indeed, he is the "Unknown God". St. Paul was on to something when he wrote: "We see things imperfectly, like blurred images in a mirror, but someday we will see everything with perfect clarity. Now all that we know is partial and incomplete, but someday we will know everything completely, just as God knows us" (1 Cor. 13:12). By God's grace we shall move from glory to glory (CF 2 Cor 3:18), from unknowing to being fully known.

As we journey through life, we will discover who we are. In the silent moments, we hear that small gentle voice calling us by name. When we respond to it, we will discover the One in whom we live and move and have our being. We will discover the Unknown God who cannot be defined, confined, or controlled. He stands above us and orders all our days. He sustains us throughout our life's journey and is closer to us than we are to ourselves. God is the Ground of Being. He is the Creator and Sustainer of the universe and refuses to be reduced to an object of our making. The Master of the Universe dwelt among us in the flesh. Even though we may not know how to name Him, He constantly calls us by name. We need to listen for his voice with the ears of our hearts.

"Oh! That I might repose on You! Oh! That You would enter into my heart, and inebriate me, that I may forget my ills, and embrace You, my sole good! What are You to me? In Your pity, teach me to utter it... tell me, O Lord my God, what You are for me. Speak, that I may hear. Behold, Lord, my heart is before You. Say to my soul, I am thy salvation. Let me run after and cling to You" (Confessions, chapter V).

FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

We have been reading from the Acts of the Apostles these past weeks. Thursday, we read of the development of doctrine as well as disciplines. Doctrine being a body of teaching while discipline a method of following. A manner of practice and hopefully a way of becoming more skilled in our day to



day application of the teachings of Jesus. John's Gospel shared the last of the seven I AM predicates. Which may be appreciated as an assertion. Jesus declares that I AM THE VINE AND YOU ARE THE BRANCHES. He goes on to share that pruning may be something to consider and it would be for the purposes of bearing greater fruit.

Fr. Vincent Haas was my first supervisor when I was assigned to St. Colman Parish in my first year in theology. He would, many times, encourage me to take to heart the words RE-MAIN ON THE VINE. That said there is also the challenge or perhaps the task of daily pruning. Daily consideration of that which needs to be pruned so that fruitfulness in the life of Jesus may continue. I believe we are all familiar with a daily examination of conscience. There is also (this I heard when at Seton Hall) according to Fr. Ashenbrenner an examen of consciousness. This would be a kind of discernment that would be heart felt and receptive to developing more deeply our spiritual identity. It points to a renewal of vision and likeness in relationship to Jesus. A means of appreciating how well Christ may be recognized in people like ourselves (and others). A challenge for many in our day to day. I think often (it is on my desk near my typewriter) of a quote from St. John Paul II as I visited St. Anthony of Padua some time ago. SONO UN VIANDANTE SULLO STRETTO MARCIA PIEDE DELLA TERRA. E NON DISTOLGO IL MIO PENSIERO DAL TUO VOLTO. As best I can, the translation I AM A TRAVEL-ER ON THE NARROW SIDEWALK OF THE EARTH, AND I DO NOT TAKE MY THOUGHTS AWAY FROM YOUR FACE. May we travel well in time and be conscious of that which need be pruned to arrive at the kind of fruitfulness that indicates that we seek to remain on the vine.

Looking back at some notes that I was considering going into last Tuesday's night evening prayer, they were about aligning myself with Jesus and how I try to fall into line. This has been a lifelong process and I started to think about it as Confirmation for our students is celebrated this weekend. Even today as I write this. I am pondering how these gifts have impacted my life and how they have brought me out of myself and into a world that I can participate in fully sharing humor and goodness, kindness, generosity and forgiveness. The gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord all have been granted to me during times in my life where I felt the world had swallowed me up. During my Mom's walk with dementia and extreme physical pain, wisdom and understanding brought me to the understanding to help her where she was at on any one day. I came to the understanding that to enter her world was best for both of us. Even if that meant getting into a car, driving around, stopping for a burger and fries then going to the home that she had not recognized earlier. The burger and fries became fun and the laughter brought healing. It was an internal healing for both of us and I received a talent I never knew was there. I call it, the talent of running away with Mom. There was also a lot of fortitude there because I knew, this would happen again but God gave me the knowledge of faith and laughter. Fortitude to move forward and the laughter knowing that sometime my 91 year old Mom has just played me like a Stradivarius violin. (I am laughing right now remembering this.) I have walked a path of Fear of the Lord because of a heart longing to spend eternity with Him and in doing so can see the image of God where ever I look. There is peace and joy in looking at the world this way. This has given me the ability to sit in silence and realizing that my prayers had always been answered. Maybe not the way that I would have chosen but God has always given me what I needed most. These are gifts that I pray the students receive and come to cherish as much as I have. These gifts have brought me the fruit of charity, another way to love. I find the joy that only comes with going outside of "Bobbi Land" and living in this real life with the Holy Spirit leading. I have learned the patience that comes with thoughtfulness and putting what I want aside and in doing so learned about healing of myself and others. The Spirit guides and this makes my faith stronger and brings hope. Hope for me and the world. Of course, this was a lifelong process in prayer, Eucharist, and Confession. As I reflect on all the gifts of the Spirit and the fruits that I received, my prayer is that these students speaking for themselves for the first time receive all of them. Amen


