It is clear that when the evil one approached Jesus, he was not sure of Jesus' identity but it did not deter his gross arrogance in questioning and tempting Him. "If You are the Son of God" prove it. If You will prostrate Yourself and worship me..." The presence, the voice, the words are total and complete evil presented to the One who is eternal love and goodness. One can only wonder how Jesus felt; surely disgust! How the evil one lusts for notice, obedience, complete domination - it is an existence, not a life, of unending hell. There was a time in my life when I questioned the existence of the devil - the one with the pitchfork, the horns, the tail - it seemed like a fairy tale. I no longer picture the evil one but I have no doubt as to his existence and power and obvious presence in our world. So much that happens appears to me as demonic, not just things that are bad, disturbing but truly evil frightening in their magnitude and occurrence. I name three but there are more and you can add to the list. There are the atrocious acts of terrorism - the abduction, the torture, the murder of innocent people, the bombing of churches, synagogues, mosques. There is the whole world of pornography that victimizes people, poisons peoples' souls, destroys relationships. There is the trafficking of women and children, people sold into bondage - treated worse than cattle. If all these are not demonic inspired, then from what do they arise? Clearly these are temptations offered, insinuated, accepted and acted upon. In a much, much lesser degree, all of us suffer temptation. It has to do with original sin, with human frailty and imperfection. There is no one who does not suffer temptation and, at times, gives in. Our Lord Jesus Christ and Our Lady are the exceptions. On May 8, 2025 Robert Cardinal Prevost was elected to be our pope. He was known by a few people and from the moment he appeared on the balcony he became known to the whole world as Leo XIV. From that moment people give him reverence, adulation, clutch at him, grab his hand. For him it has to be overwhelming. But there can be a temptation in all this - notice "can be" - one can go from receiving adulation to seeking it - it can be "pretty poison" and become addictive.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The tools of Lent are fasting and prayer and almsgiving. A time to consider how well we are being crafted in the one who were are baptized into and seek to reveal that same presence as we are missioned each time we leave Holy Mass. A time to consider (perhaps) where we are in need of some restoration in mind and body and spirit. The implication in our belief system that we be free of the effects of sin. The question becomes as to how we are crafting a life that is the building



up of the Body of Christ. That may imply that our preparation for the Easter event might have the consequence of our Lenten intentions and may be a deeper following in the Way of Jesus. Also, a question as to whether our Lenten practices redound to greater likeness to Jesus Himself. The

Latin "redundare" means to overflow and to have the effect of living in likeness as well. The thought being to 'increase' within ourselves the sacred presence within us. Interesting how almsgiving also asks for the direction of compassion. A religious duty in dispensing mercy and forgiveness. As often as we recite "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" can we pass beyond that which has been done or said about us that inhibits our own seeking of mercy and forgiveness? Perhaps some thought as how almsgiving might not only consider financial considerations but also the dispensing of mercy. Perhaps a disposition that may be considered during this sacred time.

In the seminary there was one appointed as infirmarian. One who was missioned to care for the sick members of the community. Monastic Abbeys had sick bays. We recall in John 13 and just before the Passover that Jesus washed the feet of disciples. Some have written that the washing of the feet implies our role as members of the Body of Christ. It is Holy Thursdays when we offer the same opportunity to wash one another's feet. Humility and servanthood in the forgiveness of others. May we consider then how well our Lenten practices may have the object of the practical development of our own relationship to Jesus in discipleship. May we dispense the alms of mercy as well.

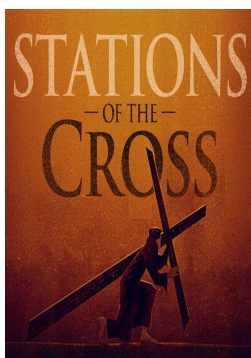

One of the significant parts of Lent to me was last Tuesday's Evening prayer the reading is James 2:14-18. It is about professing my faith and practicing it. It is a conduct of life. That means what comes out of my mouth and what is in my heart are the same thing. I will have this reading every week of Lent. You know what is good about it, I get to look back every 7 days to say how well I did. Every seven days to reflect: did I say "Good-bye and good luck" or did I make a difference. By doing this every seven day I get to adjust thought patterns in a way that over the 40 days can make a change. I get excited but I also get nervous about it. Excited in the knowledge that I want and desire the change, the nervousness is the revelation that what is in my heart extends to the world and that might not be the love of Christ. I might see how I am not kind, compassionate and merciful. The problem I sometimes run into, I can acknowledge my sins, I can confess them but still hold on to the hurt, anger that prevents me from fully forgiving others and myself. Lent gives me those 7 days to reflect on my thought process and helps me heal one week at a time. Instead of holding on to the distraction those seven days give me a line that says "how are you moving on?" I have learned over my 68 years that Lent allows me to really increase my faith. It allows me to acknowledge and slowly change my heart so that it reflects the faith I profess. My journey is not always pretty, but it does increase my faith. Like Bartimeus my desire is to see and that desire includes my bad habits as well as the good ones. The desire to see includes all of me. The desire to see requires a change of heart, requires the compassion, mercy, forgiveness and in my case, maybe a little self-control. I do not consider this Bobbi Bashing. I consider this in joy because, I will look back to 7 days and find the times I did not say "Good-bye and good luck." I did not leave people out in cold and unfed. Those seven days give me the baby steps that allow faith to increase and allow me to be more honest with myself. I love that Lent allows me to see what is truly in my heart and how that comes to the world. My journey to increased faith is one slow step at a time and while in this writing it can seem burdensome, as I do not have the words to express what the fruits that come from this look back. The joy, the kindness, the patience and peace that comes from this journey. The healing and hope that come from asking the question what does "Good-bye and good luck" look like in my life or how to change it. Asking the question every seven days does not hurt. It is an act of love that gives and teaches me compassion, mercy, and healing in forgiveness. I walk in the footsteps of Jesus and in Lent even on the hard questions I love it because it brings healing in me and I take that to the world.
