### Light on the Liturgy

1st Sunday of Lent: Why do we live the Christian life?

The attitudes, actions and over-all lifestyle that characterize a member of God's Kingdom are what make up the basic Christian moral code. It is these characteristics which flow from the nature and life of God and which tell us what it means to be followers of Christ. in other words, what it means to be Christian. important to realize here that we are to live this way not because God or the Church – or anybody – established rules and laws which we have to follow to avoid a set of prescribed punishments, of varying degrees of severity. That would be the human way. Rather, we live as Christians, following the "New Law," because we live in a personal, intimate relationship with Christ – and thus with This relationship began when we were the Trinity. baptized - "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" - and is nourished each time we participate in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. and receive Communion. However, like our relationships with one another, the relationship with Christ also requires personal contact and communication. We need to take some time out of our daily routine to talk with Jesus - after all, he was, and remains, human like you and me. We call this prayer. We can use formal, structured prayers; but we don't have to. We can stop. think of Jesus as a friend and talk to him as we would with anyone close to us. That's really all it takes.

This is fundamental. However, we have to be careful not to fall into the trap of individualism. The Christian way is not only between me and Jesus. We have been redeemed and are saved, not just individually, but as members of a community, the Church, united by baptism into the Body of Christ. As such, the Christian life is more than just getting me to heaven. Rather, it is primarily about how we relate to one another, how we live out our relationship to Christ in the way we live with one another. Recall Jesus' summary of the law: Love God with your whole heart, and love your neighbor as yourself (Mk. 12/29-31; also Mt. 25/40, 45). Tertullian, a 2nd-3rd century theologian, describes the pagans in his society as saying, "See how these Christians love one another." Do people say that of us today? If not, why not? (cont. next week)

# FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

As was the habit of a few of my seminary brothers there was the intention of reading all of the works of one particular author/writer. Back in the day it was Steinbeck or Vonnegut or Hesse to recall three. The trend continues for some of us today. I (as mentioned before) have been read-



ing the Cistercian Michael Casey. I also recommend his work in the area of spirituality. One of his works has to do with daily reflections. He reflected on a time in childhood when he was expecting immediate results from planting seeds. He recollected how he would daily go to the garden and pull up that which he had sown and expected some fruit and was disappointed. He was

counseled by his mother to wait and be patient. Lesson learned and eventually his patience was rewarded. I have read that we live in a time which has been described as the culture of immediacy. Some of that which is accessible on different websites is given to us without delay it would seem. (Recalling the days when I would visit the library at the Alta House and study biology while checking out books and this was a slow process). That said, it may ask for a bit of a persevering spirit in the area of our Lenten intentions. What we may have planted within our minds and hearts in the way of intentions may need a patient waiting in what I have read is the 'long term'. Lent is about a patient preparation for celebration of the Resurrection. To that degree how might our Lenten intentions prepare us for the return of Jesus and our share in the resurrected life? I wonder how often we give that due consideration. How well do we fix our minds on the long term and our preparation (not only for the Easter event) for the eventual return of Jesus Himself? Nowadays (again I have read) our culture can become toxic and so the need of being 'detoxed. Interesting how the word culture (some time ago) also had the meaning of preparing the earth for crops. Cultivating may be a direction that asks for a patient and persevering spirit in allowing the seeds of faith and our Lenten intentions to bear fruit. At my first pastorate I planted tulip bulbs near the stairs of the priest's residence. Having learned from my mother what it is to prepare the soil and tend the same it did bear out the flowers over time. May we be free of any impatience that would inhibit the seeds of our Lenten intentions and seek to blossom one day at a time.

### From Bobbi Bugaj

On Thursday last in my morning offering, I noticed something upcoming in the Sunday readings for Lent this year that I never considered. The Old Testament readings speak a lot about God's covenants with His people. I recalled what God said to Abraham "I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as he stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore," because he heard and obeyed God and was willing and in trust, to sacrifice his son. With Noah. (this Sunday's reading) a forever came the arc of the rainbow that God would not destroy the world again. The rainbow being a constant sign. Moses, "I will be your God and you will be my people." Then Jeremiah, a new covenant, God's law will be within people, written on their hearts. My first reaction to this was Wow, that is a lot of love. But a few minutes later, I was wondering how I live out these relationships. Do I take my part of the covenant seriously or is it just lip service. Like my wedding vows, is there a total self-giving to God. Am I fulfilling my part of the covenant? I know that God fulfills his part, but on my part, am I just doing the motions or am I a committed participant in kingdom building. There is no Bobbi Bashing here, just the thought that one of the things that I should be contemplating this Lenten season is my part and renewal of the covenant. My part of the self-giving. I love Lent because each year, I find something to restore me that I have yet to contemplate in a different way, maybe not new, just not the way I have in the past. Lent, while being restoring and healing, is also where I am also asked to reach out, stretch myself so as to allow me to participate in all these covenants better. Noah got a beautiful rainbow, Abraham got his son, Moses and his people got God, and Jeremiah tells of a new covenant: Jesus. I am amazed and speechless about what was revealed to me today in prayer. Covenants go on forever, the world is still full of evil, but I have the way, the truth and the light. The way this Lent is to think about permanent covenants, what maybe I need to stop or add to truly be a meaningful participant in faith, hope and love. I need to stretch myself to breakout of things that maybe I just got complacent to, and let slip. Today was a journey in thought that shows, in all times God is present, that he will never stop trying to have a relationship with me and others, and that in that covenant, there is so much love that he sent his Son. An obedient perfect person, to start a new covenant. You are probably going, where is she going with this, I am going to Mark 14: "While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." Have a blessed Lent!
