**(Hosea 6: 1 – 6; Ps 51; Luke 18: 9 – 14)**

Someone wrote: "If you want to make progress in charity or rather, if you are concerned not to be lacking in it, your endeavor must never be to be lifted up about anything in yourself, but always to marvel at what is in other people."

How fitting these words are as a commentary on Jesus' parable of the tax-collector and the pharisee in prayer in the temple.

The pharisee had accomplished a very good job of lifting himself so high that he could not see nor appreciate the marvel of God's merciful grace in the publican. This tax-collector, so disdained by his own people, his soul was filled with deep contrition and his eyes were focused on the infinite merciful goodness of God even in a dark corner of the temple. Even in the dark, he could see and God was his light.

How sad that the Pharisee was so blind to the Lord's mercy and so filled with himself; his blatant self-adoration, gratitude, love filled himself to overflowing. How could he be in need of anything, forgiveness included? As far as God was concerned, He was allowed to listen. The pharisee did need an audience – the pharisee could and did count on God's presence – but only that. No matter where he chose to stand in the temple, he was in the dark. In a church, any church, in this monastery church we are surrounded by brothers and sisters whose presence speaks clearly of the marvel of God's gracious mercy. We are, by God's love, deeply attracted to Him, seeking communion with Him – this is what it means to be people of faith, people in the Light. It is what we desire and what our God desires for us.

For the grace to see and appreciate the marvel of God's mercy around us and, of course, to recognize and appreciate it in ourselves,

is to be in the Light. "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord!" This invitation, this command, comes from God Himself.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Some authors indicate that the pillars of Lent are (central core if you will) are prayer and fasting and almsgiving. A pattern to be observed in the imitation of Moses and later Elijah one prior to the receiving the 10 commandments (Moses) and the other in anticipating communication from the Lord (Elijah). Jesus entered the desert for the same period and all three were prepared for the work they were to accomplish. And so, a time of



preparation to consider our relationship to God (prayer) our relationship to ourselves (fasting) and our relationship to others (almsgiving). The concept of self-denial has the direction of our preparation for the Easter Vigil where we renew our own baptismal

relationship with Jesus. We read in Matthew, Mark, and Luke about the temptations of the devil. And again, preparation for His ministry. It might be a thought that Quadragesima (Latin for fortieth) may be a time for our own renewed preparation for our own ministry given at Baptism as those seeking to bring people to a knowledge of God and our witness by the conduct of our lives (how we accompany one another in His Way) and how we seek to advance the Kingdom life through our daily living. Recall **THY KINGDOM COME THY WILL BE DONE ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN** and so a mindfulness of our baptismal role in modeling the life of Jesus. Do we seek to be molded into likeness to Christ may be the question in this holy season? Likeness in the manner of representing His presence within ourselves. Of course, that might ask for some remodeling. The Italian "modello" gives us the words "model or mold." The Latin "modulus" give us the word "standard." Might we consider living according to the standards of Jesus? May we consider as well, being continually molded into His likeness? A couple of questions that might assist in our Lenten journey. May our travel through this holy season be an opportunity, a seasonable time to be in accord with what we heard from Matthew about being salt of the earth and light of the world. May our anticipation of the Easter Vigil also remind us that each day is in anticipation to be prepared for His promised return. As those who celebrate matins in monasteries who pray **COME LORD JESUS** may we too look forward to His second coming.

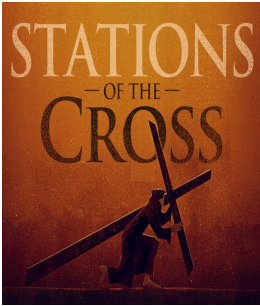

## From Bobbi Bugaj

Going into this Lenten season I have been humming a song called Have Mercy, Son of David by Steve Angrisano and for Lent at all the Sunday Masses we will be hearing As the Deer by Bernadette Farrell. I like them both for different reasons. First, sometimes I feel like Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52) on the side of the road. I am on the path that I need to be but at times blind to everything around me. The song we will hear at the Sunday Masses in Lent, As the Deer, got me thinking about my longing to walk this path, thirsting for God. Tears also resonate because I know the question by some friends, “Where is your God?” So, both songs belong in my heart this Lent but they are not sad thoughts. No Bobbi Bashing, just content thoughts about where I am on this path. Acknowledgement that I might be on the side of the road calling out for mercy and knowing that God hears me. That is what brings joy on this journey. Yes, there are hard times, sometimes, just the hard times of life and sometimes when I try to bend the will of God my way and it ends disastrously. Then the thought about a deer yearning for water, having the presence of the Holy Spirit in my heart taking me to water, and a love that encompasses everything, coming every day and maybe I got blind or distracted and sat down. Lent to me is always a joyous. Sometimes painful but the joy is in the discovery of the painful and what I need to hear if I can not see. Bartimaeus stating “I want to see” and As the Deer we sing “Hope in God and praise him still.” Faith and hope, the path of love that leads to reconciliation of my sins, my actions, my words and my thoughts. Lent is a reset button that allows me to delete all that I have picked up that keeps me on the side of the road blind. The disciples in Mark telling Bartimaeus “Take courage: get up, he is calling you” is so healing. I am called and I respond with everything that I have. Lent for me is a time of yearning, a time to call out and have the faith that will heal me. There is a time for joy in the journey that may be a little painful especially when realizing that some of what I cast off last year, is back. The stubbornness, the control and I will struggle with them this Lent again! They get easier to lay down and I while they may creep back, maybe, I laid them down longer this time. Lent is a journey of love, and for me there will be prayer that I will become the person God would like me to be. There will be sorrow and tears in the struggle but also joy when I realize as faith grows the struggle is less. Faith and hope come with tears and longing because they show the love of God in the person of Jesus. This Lent, as in all the Lents before, I will see, experience and know mercy and longing because God loves me so much he sent his Son, and I will experience and remember the depths of that love in Holy Week and Easter Sunday and beyond. ***I love Lent.***
