Continued from last weeks bulletin...

We recently heard passages read from the Book of Ruth at Sext in our church. When Boaz was bargaining for her at the city gate with the elders, Ruth had no say in the matter. Daughters and girls had even less standing than women; they were given away in marriage and were expected to obey. I was struck by this contrast when singing the hymn for Lauds yesterday. In the second verse, it is talking about our Creator taking on flesh. And then in the third verse it says, For this how wondrously he wrought! A maiden in her lowly place, Became, in ways beyond all thought, The chosen vessel of his grace. Mary was just a maiden – a teenage girl without any rights or prestige. And yet God plucked her out of that obscurity, and made her the highest human being of all time – and for all eternity! This was not by accident. Mary had cooperated with grace to set herself up for this moment. She lived her life for the next world, not this one. She made all the right decisions to remain sinless from her birth. Think of Jesus' parable of Lazareth and the rich man. Dives, as he came to be known, lived for this world only. Ok, he lived sumptuously during those years, but how short that span is! Just a speck of sand in a bird's beak. Now he is in misery, and it will never come to an end. My dad had it right – it makes much more sense to live one's life for the next world, rather than this one. And nowadays, as I look back on those nights as a child with my father under the starlight, it gives me pleasure to think of him now enjoying the eternity he so loved to preach about.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Housekeeping and home maintenance came to mind this past week. Perhaps the word "tidy" might be apt or (recalling my days at the restaurant on Saturday's and particular chores or tasks that need more time and attentiveness along with a to do list) "custodial" care comes to mind and having the time to attend to certain projects that asked for more time and attention to detail.



Being snowbound might have been frustration for some but the opportunity to have the time to care for certain things that perhaps asked for attentive detail with time available. Of course, some areas can suffer from benign neglect while we are heeding (some of us) the warning

'shelter in' or be strong and firm. There is also the opportunity for self-reflection in the days where we are experiencing limitation. We may be home bound (so to speak) yet at same time we are heavenly bound. What is the condition of our personal homes that might also suggest our bodies. I have read that "homeward-bound" is from the old English with the meaning of ships returning from foreign countries. Homecoming is a returning home. The word "bound" too can be used as verb to mean a 'springing forward' while as an adjective meaning 'under obligation.' Interesting as well as the word 'obliging' indicates a willingness to be of service to others. In the days ahead, we may ask if we are truly at home with the presence of the divine guest within us? Again this may be a time to encourage some thought about the condition of our spiritual lives. Perhaps to be conscious of our habits and our inner spiritual lives that might benefit and advance our way to the Father. May we use this seasonal interruption (so to speak) as a pause to consider areas within ourselves that might be in need of attentive prayer and development that as we journey daily as a people who seek to embody 'thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven'.

When preparing for Tuesday's evening prayer I thought again about the passage, Your love should be sincere, but thought of it in a new way. Just perhaps, a review of what I am saying to the world. This happened because a few weeks ago when reviewing the Creed with the 7th grade PSR, I made the observation by Jaroslav Pelikan (paraphrasing) that when you say I believe in something you are also say do not believe in something else. It is kind of a reverse look at how I practice my faith. So when I say "I believe in one God" I am saying yes to God but what am I saying no to. Do I have only one God or are there "idols" that sometimes moves God off to the side. I get to ponder every four weeks in the Liturgy of the hours Romans "your love must be sincere" and I have multiple copies of the saying "Who do you say that I am?" So, I am appreciating the baptismal question, "Do you reject Satan and all his empty promises" because I have not only seen but experienced how the glitter of this world can have no substance. The empty promises of this world come with envy, jealousy and chasing something I have no talent for and no capacity for. I have found that the gifts I have are best done in heartfelt love with words of faith. When I say "I believe in one God" I know that I will spend my time acting and voicing a road quite different from this world.

It is the path less traveled. It is the path one stumbles on, but has the Spirit picking me up and reminding me what love, compassion, mercy and forgiveness is. Not just looks like, but how it is integrated into my heart. I also thought of Exodus 3. When asked about a name God replied "I AM who Am... I Am sent me to you." In the last few days I have smiled and saw some of the irony in my life. But also, experienced hope. To think about my words, what I am saying and what I am implying. Do I really believe both or one? I reject Satan and all his empty promises, but do I take that out into this world where glitter is fickle and fleeting. The thought that sustains me is, I can step away and reevaluate what I believe to stay on THE path that leads to eternal life. That also in the I believe is a way to believe and practice stronger. Sincerity is lifelong. God's love points in directions promising healing and peace. My belief in God allows me to see the world of his creation that includes restoration, renewal and rejuvenation. God asking to look a little closer into what I am saying and then what I practicing is healing. A little hard but healing. I do smile while writing this because there is peace. The Spirit is leading me on a journey that asks: Is there sincerity in your word and my answer is yes, and if not yes, working on it with my whole heart.


