Light on the Liturgy

Lent: Living God's Way, with Repentance and Humility

During this coming week, we celebrate Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, which has traditionally been a time of repentance and penance. This manner of observing Lent is already described in *The Teaching of the Apostles*, written c. 230 AD. In fact, the practice of penance as a sign of repentance can be traced back to Christ himself. We find it at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. In both Mark's and Matthew's Gospels, he begins his preaching with the proclamation: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel [good news]" (Mk. 1/15; also Mt. 4/17).

This fundamental dictum of Christian tradition flows very naturally from our discussion of the Reign of God and living according to God's Way - because it is part of Jesus' initial proclamation of the Kingdom. The first quality or characteristic of God's Way is admitting that, without God's help, we are powerless in the face of evil; but, with God's help (which is always available to us), and in union with the saving life, death and resurrection of Jesus, sin and evil have no power over us (see Rom. 6/14). With God's help, we can overcome the tendencies toward sin, like selfishness and anger, that rise up within us. Unfortunately, at times, we give in; and that's on us; we are sinners. Thus repentance is a constant call, beckoning us to return to our merciful and forgiving God, to follow his way.

What this admission of our sinfulness and this need to turn back to God require is true humility. This is a tricky word. Many think it means "groveling in the dirt," beating our breasts, proclaiming how terrible we are. It does come from the Latin word, *humus*, meaning ground or dirt. Yet, humility need not mean any of these demeaning phrases. What it does mean is "grounded in reality," accepting our place in God's creation (dependant on, and obedient to, God), admitting our weakness and sinfulness – <u>but always aware</u> that we are created in God's image and likeness and redeemed by Jesus, the Christ. We can and should respect ourselves – and all other people. Humility means putting others' needs before our own, sacrificing for the love of God and others, and living out the potential within us to proclaim to the world that we are children of God. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I had mentioned this past week that one of the first books given my class at the seminary was a book by Fr. E.J. Cuskelly and the



title 'A Heart To Know Thee.' (He authored another book 'No Cowards In The Kingdom' which, I have read, is about making adjustments in the pilgrimage of life). The title of the first book reflects what was said in the prophet Jeremiah. The words "I will give them a heart to know me" and 'they will return to me with all their hearts." The heart of Solomon was praised by the Queen of Sheba. She shared that everything that was said of him was true through her experience of his presence and responses.

A mention too, that he far exceeded what was said of him. Later we learn that Solomon's heart became fragmented. As I have read, his heart became divided. His connection with God had been compromised by distractions within his own relationships. As we begin the season of Lent it may be an opportunity to consider whether I/ we are "loving God" with all our hearts. Biblically we appreciate the heart is the seat of emotions as well as our will and reasoning. A "heart to know thee" maybe contrasted with being hard hearted which was a warning to some who refused the message of the prophets as well as Jesus Himself. Is it true of me/us that what I/we share in the Eucharist informs our hearts and so helps us to conform to the life and teachings of Jesus Himself? The prophet Joel gives us the words REND YOUR HEART which is an acknowledgement of the need for repentance and restoration. Lent then becomes a time that we pray and fast and give alms and seek the kind of relationship that is restorative and recreative. King David asked for a clean heart and renewed spirit. He too became distracted and fragmented. Perhaps one of the intentions of the season is to set aside some time for reflection as to our relationship with the Sacred Heart. One of the folks I was in the company of some years ago quoted Brother Lawrence who authored "The Practice of the Presence of God. In a word my friend shared we seek to possess the heart of Christ by being empty of distractions that diminish our desire to be in union with Him. Question becomes: what then needs to be vacated from our hearts to allow the presence of Christ to flow from us? May we seek then to be attentive to that which distracts us and make "heart felt" adjustments though our own pilgrimage of life.
