(2 Kings 2: 1, 6-14, Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-18)

In Chapter Four of the Rule, Saint Benedict tells his monks,

“Yearn for everlasting life with holy desire. Day by day remind yourself that you are going to die” (RB 4.46-47). Today’s first reading offers us a wonderful example of accompaniment in the dying process. Elijah is preparing to depart from this world and Elisha refuses to abandon him. “As the Lord lives, and as you live, I will not leave you” (2 Kings 2:2). Human mortality is messy. The death process is distressing and frightful. No one should be left to go it alone. I was with my mom as she entered the final stages of her life. I remember asking her if she had any fears. Her answer was simple and to the point. “I have never done this before.” As I listened to her, I was overwhelmed by the realization that I was about to lose the woman who was not only my mother but who had also become my best friend and confidante. Reminiscent of Elisha’s pledge, “I will not leave you,” I told my mother that I would be with her as far as the door and that dad and the rest of her deceased loved ones would escort her across the threshold into the presence of the King. No one should face death alone.

Elijah mounted the fiery chariot alone, but the affection offered by his devoted disciple must have been a great support. The isolation we have endured as a result of the pandemic has made some of us more aware of our need for human contact and interaction. Many of us are dealing with unresolved grief stemming from the fact that we were not able to be with a loved one at the time of his or her death or attend the funeral. Elijah’s journey to the river Jordan is an illustration of the long journey we must be willing to take passing from isolation to communion. As the anxiety and threats of COVID recede, we must be willing to journey out of the darkness into the light of day. Having been forced into isolation, we need to discover a way of developing healthy and life-giving relationships. We have to be willing to dream dreams and envision a better society. Through faith in Christ, we can become caring human beings.

“The truth is that only in the mystery of the incarnate Word does the mystery of man take on light. For Adam, the first man was a figure of Him Who was to come,(20) namely Christ the Lord. Christ, the final Adam, by the revelation of the mystery of the Father and His love, fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear... He Who is “the image of the invisible God” (Col. 1:15),(21) is Himself the perfect man. To the sons of Adam, He restores the divine likeness which had been disfigured from the first sin onward” (Gaudium et Spes, #22).

Instead of yielding to impatience or despondency in the face of overwhelming challenges, we should turn our thoughts to the goodness of the Lord towards those who trust in Him. I love you Jesus, my love. Fill my heart with faith, hope, and charity. Help me never sin again. Grant that I might love you always and then do with me what you will.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

At times we may need to be reminded about the content of our daily prayers, and particularly the Lord's prayer. More than a small part of our liturgy of our celebrations it is a reminder of the direction of blessedness that is part of the Sermon on the Mount. the direction of being salt and light. the direction of moving



toward and seeking guidance and direction in His Way. In Matthew 11 there is a type of invitation. we read 'take my yoke upon you and learn from me and being joined to together with Jesus in our movement through this life and into the next less his arrival as he has promised to return. question (for me at least) do I seek to grow in the knowledge of His Way and to cultivate and

tend my relationship through my day to day? We read in 2 Corinthians at a favorable time I listened to you, and on a day of salvation I helped you. Behold now is a favorable time, behold now is a day of salvation. The sacred author borrows from Isaiah 49:8 and indicating that we all have a role to play in God's work of reconciliation. It is, as well, a call to deepen their own conversion. (In his context St. Paul is seeking to be restored after some misunderstanding in the community) the concept of *Conversio Deo* refers to a spiritual transformation. In the context of our daily living, it may be an opportunity or again a 'favorable time' to consider how we are profitable servants in the Holy Name of Jesus. Do we appreciate how we have the capacity of living in His likeness seeking to embody the words *THY WILL BE DONE* on earth as it is in heaven. each day then is a favorable time to consider how we manifest the presence of Jesus whose Body and Blood we digest. some would as those who are baptized, we are set apart to carry His presence to others. May we accept the daily challenge of making the kind of choices that are indicative of the relationship with have through the eucharist. May we be salt and light in seeking to season and bring to maturity His presence shared with others. May we illuminate the one light as well that we are called to reflect His image and likeness to others.

From Bobbi Bugaj

This week I am on a vacation/retreat. (Mark 6:31) I have been relaxing and praying. I brought my iPad with me and when I opened the Pages software it opened to something I had written 10 months before my Mom passed away. (Pages had never opened like that and I found it odd.) It was only a few lines and I read it. It was about being grateful for my Mom and what she taught me about prayer and prayer times. The words are very hopeful and not broken. To reread them, felt like holding a hand, but was Mom holding mine, or me holding Mom's. Maybe a little of both. The words were hopeful and grateful. I do not remember writing them but the date and the fact that it was on my iPad and not a hard paper journal means I wrote it while she was in the hospital. Also, on my vacation/retreat I brought a couple of books to read and one of them is by Anne Lamont called Almost Everything. It is a book on hope. Prayer gives me hope, or maybe I see it better when I pray. Prayer strengthens my faith and that gives me hope which strengthens my faith. I am not sure that I define hope but the Catholic Catechism 1818 says this: "The virtue of hope responds to the aspiration to happiness which God has placed in the heart of every man; it takes up the hopes that inspire men's activities and purifies them so as to order them to the Kingdom of heaven; it keeps man from discouragement; it sustains him during times of abandonment; it opens up his heart in expectation of eternal beatitude. Buoyed up by hope, he is preserved from selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from charity." The writers with the inspiration of the Spirit did a good job and I like it. I experience hope in the dark times and in the good times. My faith is my foundation and prayer is what sustains it. It moves me out of me. What I mean by that is that it let's me see goodness in darkness and God's love in my tears. It also lets me see that the rain which can change my plans for a day or two as cleaning and restoring life. Hope takes me out of me and allows my prayers to see God clearer. I can feel hope, that is the grace (it's all grace) that allows me to hold a hand in a scary situation and know that God is there. Hope says I am not alone. With hope, the darkness has light and love. My hope brings gratefulness, not just in the bad times but in the good times. It allows me to walk in a world and see God's love at all times. It takes my faith and says look to God and follow him, God will keep you safe, and he is always with you. Hope is hard to define, but not hard for me to find. I can show you hope by living in hope. Here, on a bench, watching the rain, I found that God gives me hope and it is like holding a hand. That is love.
