# Guest Article: Rev. Jerome Machar OCSO

Habakkuk 1:12-2:4. Matthew 17:14-20 "I will stand at my guard post, and station myself upon the rampart, And keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what answer he will give to my complaint" (Hab. 2:1). These words taken from the prophet Habakkuk speak to the heart of people anxious about the virus and perplexed with doubts. Not knowing what the future will bring, with the prophet we stand on the ramparts and watch for the answer from the Lord. Faith tells us that we open the ears of our hearts to hear the Word of the Lord and ponder His message. Because God is ever faithful and true to His Word, he will not disappoint the expectations of those who wait to hear what he will say unto them. We wait in hope. Though the Lord be slow in coming, we have the assurance of His faithfulness. When the night is at its darkest, there is the promise of

our own. "Lord, there is no one else that we can turn to. Your words give us eternal life" (Jn. 6:68).

the dawn. As we wait, we make the words of Simon Peter

"I will stand at my guard post... and keep watch to see what he will say to me." The prophet vigil is prompted by faith that has been immersed in love. "I was asleep, but my heart was awake... when I heard my lover knocking and calling to me" (Song 5:2). God will not disappoint the

believing expectations of a word from the Lord. The faithful servant walks and works with the ears of his heart open to the word of the lord. He faces all life's challenges with expectant faith, confident that the Lord will not try him

beyond his strength. The apostle Peter put it quite beautifully. "Though you have never seen him, you love him. Even though you do not see him now, you trust him. Your heart overflows with inexpressible joy that has been

touched with glory" (1 Pet. 1:8).

T. S. Eliot offered this wise insight: "We shall not cease from exploration/ And the end of all our exploring /Will be to arrive where we started/ And know the place for the first time." And so, my brothers, let us stand at our guard post. Let us station ourselves upon the rampart, listening if there is a word from the Lord.



# FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

As a freshman in college (Bowling Green) I opted to join the ROTC program. I have a photo some place where I am teamed up with one Tom Cyphert who continued in the program while I entered the seminary at Borromeo. That would have been the Air Force program. Alignment was an important concept, as I recall, our flight leader sharing that if he told us to march up a wall then .... not sure I remember the kind of urgency that was involved with the discipline of the march. That would be to walk in measured steps and to move in order and in Italian a means of



proceeding. To that degree each closing of our celebrations of the Eucharist indicates a aoina forth with the continued presence of Christ within us. We are called to set out in alignment with the one whose presence is within us. Occupied with the business of proclaiming the Gospel. We are possessed with the presence of Christ (as it were) to live in likeness to the Word made Flesh. The question becomes (perhaps) are we/ am I seeking to be alignment with the presence as we proceed and move in the direction of the

gospel life with consciousness? Do I/we go forward and make progress in my/our journey of faith? Do we seek to grow and develop in likeness to the Word made flesh that is communicated to us in receiving His body and blood? It is possible in the world of today (as in the past) that we may become misaligned. It may be possible that the arrangement of or lives may become out of step with the way and the truth and the life of Jesus. That said at times a self-review to appreciate and see how faithful we are being in the direction of being missioned may be needed. The Latin 'Missonem' I have read comes from the Jesuit tradition of being 'sent abroad'. For ourselves we are sent or commissioned to be dispatched in the service of the gospel in the areas in which we live and move and hopefully communicate the one who is the ground of our being and the One we seek to live in daily likeness to as well. It is Him in we move and have our being comes from the Acts of the Apostles. They too were missioned as I recall reading in philosophy that God is the ground of our being. May we seek the kind of likeness in being aligned with the one we are baptized into and are nourished by as well.

### From Bobbi Bugaj

Sometimes I consider and ponder on being a child of God and do I offer the same likeness of God for others? Heavy stuff when pondering what I need to amend or redirect in my life to grow into the image of perfection. As I sat on our chilly deck in a coat Wednesday evening watching the rain (our deck has an awning that will soon need to be taken down) I listened to the sound of the gentle rain. It was beautiful in the dark. I went on to think of summer vacations with family members in Michigan, camping on Lake Superior and watching the waves on the water meet the shoreline. In both cases, all is what it should be, doing what God wanted nature to do and it was perfect. I thought of the prayers from Tuesday evening prayer about service and I thought of gifts that God has given me over the years. One is to laugh at myself. I have learned over time that in hard situations, if I step back and really open myself to the situation it sometime shows situations that are really funny. My Mom being a dementia patient who cannot recognize me, could not remember what I did to accidently make her angry, but she still knew she was mad at me. She would shortly after forgive me, and there is beauty in that because receiving forgiveness allowed me to go on more peacefully. That I think with a smile is a faith that shines an image of the face of God. The world was working in a way that God had made, an image of God and an action of faith that transcends this world and works through the faith of my Mom and me finding peace and healing in situations that we could not find answers in. It was the faith in her daily prayers she still knew and said with more faith because her heart knew even if her mind did not. That is the laughter and joy in being in the presence of the image of God. And that image went both ways between Mom and me. She learned over time to just be who she was at that moment and trusted in the Lord to give me the gift of laughter. In turn, it transformed my world to see God daily in sunsets, hearing the rain in the dark, remembering the water hitting the shoreline in Michigan washing away the rough edges of rocks. The thought again came, if I could surrender myself so completely as to listen closer and follow instead of trying to lead and fix, then my service to others as the image of God would be more peaceful and healing. I can be renewed by confession, fed by Eucharist, remembering that while I might need subtle changes, God will help me do that. I have realized as I have grown older that going where faith leads takes me to images of God in others and in the world. Service may sound like a hard word but with God is really not. It is just the steps that come naturally in faith, hope and love. Service becomes naturally my outward sign of faith and my inward peace to follow where the Spirit leads. I love God and what he gives me. God is good.
