# Light on the Liturgy

4th Sunday of Easter: The Law of Love in Daily Life

Just as the Old Testament is, for us Christians, the foundation for the New Testament, the fullness of revelation, so too the Old Law, the Law of Moses, is the foundation for the New Law, the Law of Jesus, proclaimed by his example and teaching. Jesus is clear about this early in his Sermon on the Mount when he tells us "I have not come to abolish [the law and the prophets] but to fulfill" (Matt. 5/17). As we have seen, this means that he calls us to a higher standard than the 10 commandments. They still give us the foundation of how we are to live our lives, but Jesus says that there is more to "God's Way" than this. We are called to the follow the Law of Love, where our motivation is our love for God and for one another.

So, what does it mean to live the Law of Love. God's Way, in our daily lives? Looking to the New Testament, we find a couple of general principles to which Jesus points us; and then, in a lengthy discourse called the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. Chaps. 5-7)), Matthew presents Jesus ascending the mountain as the New Moses and giving us this New Law. He teaches us how to live at this higher level; he clarifies what exactly God's Way is. We are to live the way God lives and loves. We are to strive to "be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt. 5/48). Of course, we can never be "like God." That is beyond our reach. However, God does call us to follow his example of how to love; and he gives us the help, the grace, to do that through the power of Jesus' death and resurrection. "For God all things are possible" (Mt. 19/26). What is required of us is to cooperate with God's call and love one another as he loves so that the world may know who our God truly is and may realize that a life of this sort is possible.

Next week we will look to Jesus' example and teachings in the Gospels to see how he lived and how he related to other people so as to get some idea of what God's Way is. Jesus, fully human and fully divine, lived a human life just as you and I do; and thus he shows what is possible for his followers. (cont. next week)

# FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

The word 'stage' came to mind this past week to the degree that there were roles acted out by the members of the Jerusalem church in the readings from the Acts of the Apostles. There were the introductions of certain individuals like



Peter and John. Then followed Barnabas. In time there were the individuals Stephen and Philip and St. Paul himself. Each had a unique role in the playing out of the ministry given through the Church after the experience of Pentecost. A teacher of mine would often comment that as the body of the church we are involved in roles and goals and relationships. (At least

that was how I interpreted as we all have a role to play as well as goals to achieve and hopefully develop the kind of relationships with others that would establish us as a blessed community and the body of Christ). The word 'stage' might also have a sense of a "period" of development over time. The word also has a connection with steps on a 'ladder' (I have read). I think of the Ladder of the Beatitudes. How might I/we progress in the ascent to that which we are called to be as blessed people. Each rung being an aspect of our union with Jesus (according to Jim Forest). That said, we too might consider the stages of the development of the ministries in the Acts of the Apostles. They followed the direction of the Holy Spirit. Their orientation was determined by their seeking to live on life's stage as members of His body. It is Christ who directs through the power of the Holy Spirit poured upon us. The question becomes one of being alert to the direction of Jesus Himself who in Matthew missioned His disciples to go out to proclaim the Gospel to the world. Inasmuch as Acts gives us different individual at different times in the development of the mission, we too might be alert to where we are at in the manner of appreciating what stage we are in and how consciously we are making progress in the communication of the Gospel life. Again, it is the concept of accepting the role given us at Baptism to be salt and light in relationship to those near and far. It may sound ambitious but we appreciate now the Jerusalem community was one that expanded over time and amid persecution. They were guided by the Holy Spirit. They were in continual formation and alert to sharing that which they received in the breaking of the bread. May we appreciate the same as we process through the stages of our lives.

## From Bobbi Bugaj

I was sitting, as it is a ritual of mine, on my deck this past Wednesday enjoying all the signs and wonders of spring around me. I then had the memory of being on retreat to Mount Saviour Monastery and watching sheep, I missed the donkeys the last time I was there, they did not have any. They used to keep donkeys (and a llama or two) with the sheep. (They now have three dogs.) I was told that the donkeys were good for being loud when a predator would attack the sheep but they could not do much more in defending them, although being loud was a great warning. Then I remembered one time while on retreat there, I saw a donkey do something amazing for one of the sheep. The sheep was trying to go in a direction that was away from the rest of the flock. The donkey went and after about 5 minutes positioned the sheep between his "chin" and his chest and literally picked it up. They donkey was carrying it back. He could only take about three steps at a time because the sheep was struggling to get away and go in the direction the sheep wanted to go. But the donkey just picked him up again and started back to the flock, he did not leave the sheep. This went on for about 30 minutes or so. Chin, lift, walk, let go to reposition and start again. until he got the sheep back with the fold. Over the years when I remember this happening, I always think how wonderful the shepherd (Brother Pierre) was in that there had to be a special bond between the donkey and the sheep that was cultivated by the shepherd. The bond between both donkey and sheep was such, that neither got hurt. I had heard so much about stubborn donkeys. that the love and patience that donkey had was surprising. The donkey showed that there was more than one way to lead. He did not kick or bit, he guietly just did what he needed to do for the sheep. Had we not been looking in the direction of this incident, we would have missed it. While Brother Pierre was surprised when we told him what we saw, he also smiled and nodded. See, the donkey had found a balance to lead and instruct, the patience to do it and did it well. I got a lesson that day in what stubbornness renewed can become: service, humility peace, and love. It also showed our bonds with the Shepherd makes us better. Blessed Easter Season!
