"[The command of the Lord] is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out (Deut. 30:14)." God has spoken and we need only heed his voice. Through the commandments, God has revealed his heart to us. Recall the words spoken by St. Paul in Athens, "In him, we live and move and have our being. As some of your poets have said, 'we are his offspring'" (Acts 17:28). Through baptism, we have been made members of the Body of Christ, who are near to the heart of the Son, who is near to the heart of the Father. Faith is an interpersonal relationship with the Living God who desires to speak heart to heart with us. The commandments of the Lord are not high and out there, no, they are deep within us, written on the tablets of our hearts. We have only to be still and listen to that small voice echoing in our hearts and then do what he tells us. Because the Word is in our heart, we have only to believe with the heart, that the promises of old are fulfilled in Christ and then conform our lives to what we have heard. I am reminded of the conferring of the Gospel Book during the rite of Ordination of deacons: "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you have become. Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach."

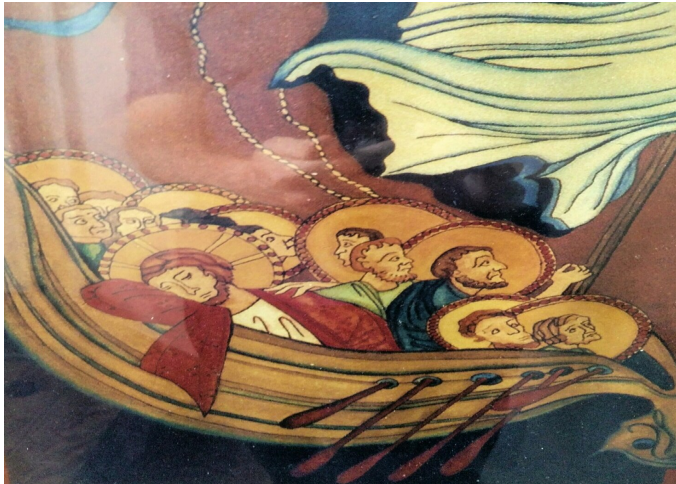
"The word of God is alive and active. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword. It can pierce the division between soul and spirit, joint and marrow. It can expose the innermost thoughts and desires of the heart" (Heb. 4:12). One who heeds the voice of God must be willing to be attentive to God and live in a relationship with Him because He desires to guide us. The Word of God is not an old dusty document preserved on some dusty shelf of an abandoned, ancient archive. Granted, we can choose to ignore it, however, it will not ignore us. We can turn a deaf ear to the Word, but the voice that speaks it continues to echo in our hearts. "Even if we are unfaithful, He remains faithful because he cannot deny himself" (2 Tim. 2:13). God who reveals himself to us is unchanged and unchanging. "God is love. Everyone who abides in love lives in union with God and God abides in him" (1 Jn. 4:16). The Living Word has been implanted in our hearts by the Spirit of Love. Because we have been immersed in the waters of Divine Love, we are capable of producing the fruits of love. "When we speak the truth in love, we will grow in all things to be more like Christ who is the head" (Eph. 4:15). God is already in our hearts, molding our words to be as loving as they are in his heart.

God has made his dwelling among us. Through baptism and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, we have been made repositories of the implanted Word. Having been grafted to God who is ever faithful and ever true, we are challenged to live lives worthy of our calling. Speaking to the 2019 graduating class of the U of Utah, Rev. France A. Davis repeated a lesson he learned from his parents. "Be what you is and not what you ain't. Because if you ain't what you is, then you is what you ain't" (Rev. France A. Davis, U of Utah 2019 Commencement). If we wish to be the image and likeness of God who is the same yesterday, today, and forever, we must hold firm to the anchor of our soul, otherwise, we will be set adrift and be tossed about by every wind that blows our way.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We read from The Prophet Amos was read this last Tuesday. The scripture closed with the words 'prepare to meet your God'. The context would be important as the leadership was being denounced for certain actions not in keeping with care of the community. The words might also be used (as we recall) in the context of the Baptist 'prepare the way for the Lord' (also in Isaiah 40). One indicating judgment and the



other "a setting in order" in relationship to Jesus. Perhaps the return of the Lord doesn't often come to our daily considerations and tasks. Some of us recall the words in the liturgy as the proclamation of our mystery in faith with the acclamation 'Christ has died. Christ has risen and Christ will come again.' As I have read 'while waiting to see him face-to-face the Church celebrate, his real but hidden presence in the Eucharist.' In First Corinthians we appreciate in Chapter 11, a direction of self-examination. We read that as a people of God there is the direction of self-examination. A discernment that may lead to repentance and reform. The act of preparing may ask for a setting in order so that a transformation may be that which is altered or changed if not in keeping with the Gospel life. A question of continually seeking to be shaped and fashioned in the likeness and the image of Jesus whom we digest. How (a question of) well then do we reflect the words of Blessedness in the Sermon on the Mount? Jesus as the new Moses with descriptors to consider and examine as to how we may depict a likeness to Jesus. Changes of habit and routine and the old beaten path (so to speak) can be a challenge as we too are contesting with the presence of the evil one. The words 'deliver us from evil' might prompt a consideration of what influences our manner of life in the direction of awaiting His return. May we seek to be set free from any attitude or behavior that impedes our being ready for His return as He has promised.

The Gospel this past Tuesday was from Matthew 8: 23-27. The verse of the Gospel is "As Jesus got into a boat, his disciples followed him. I smiled. There have been many times that I followed Jesus onto a boat when suddenly a storm followed. I know just about nothing about boats, how they stay afloat. What happens when a storm comes and exactly how safe I am or am not. Sorry when Jesus gets on, I go tentatively and eye the boat extensively, most of the time with an eye of trepidation, but I get on determined not to fail. Then the storm happens and I start to question this decision multiple times. I, like the disciples in the boat, go to Jesus and say "Lord, save us! We are perishing!" (Smile here.) I follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Jesus and I know that it is not a smooth sailing boat. I also know that Jesus has not and does not ever abandon me, so in the storms of life, like most things, when I am not in control I question not trust. I have learned over time and continue to learn that it is my fear not my faith that sometimes comes to the forefront in a storm and I smile because I acknowledge that Jesus does remind me "O you of little faith." Those reminders come with the knowledge I do see God in all his splendor and grandeur every day. This includes always keeping me safe, guiding me through the storms of life that scare me and never has he abandoned me. I have always liked this reading because it gives me a reminder that when I follow in Jesus's footsteps it is he who keeps me afloat in these times. That together we built a relationship with faith and love and while I sometimes stumble, ask questions, Jesus is there with patience and love. It is in faith and hope that I got on the boat. It is in love and patience that Jesus guides me in understanding that storms come and go, but he does not. I have to admit in times like this, it is in my prayer times, at Mass that I find the peace of Jesus in my heart. In fully participating and saying, I am scared and I know you are here Lord, that I can place the fear and anxiety with Jesus and follow him. That is why I smile when I read this Gospel. I, again like the disciples, follow Jesus on a boat that I am afraid of. I am not in control, I do not know enough to make me feel good, I just follow and hope. It is in this hope that faith is strengthened and love abounds. It is in this hope that I know that it is love that keeps me afloat. Also, I do not walk on to this boat alone. I walk on to it with others who are in or have been in the same situation and know God will keep us safe. They share that faith with me. They tell me that they are scared too, but Jesus is there and it is in the following him that storms calm. My destination getting on the boat is to follow in Jesus's footsteps and find eternal life. The storm points to the fact that in this life, I can feel like I am sinking, but the journey on the boat lets me remember that Jesus is with me through all my encounters and that I am loved and safe. That knowledge makes me happy and gives me the ability to get in the next boat on my destination to eternal life.

Cost is \$15.00 per person which includes light appetizers & refreshments. Cash Bar is also available.

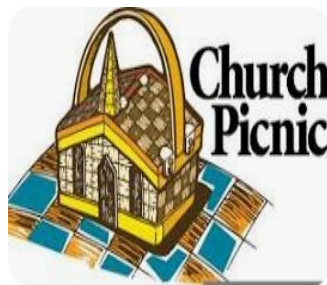
