(Amos 8:4-7, 1 Timothy 2:1-8, Luke 16:1-13)

Queen Elizabeth quoted a verse from a WW II song when she addressed the English people during the COVID pandemic. "We'll meet again, Don't know where. Don't know when. But I know we'll meet again some sunny day" (Vera Lynn). These words came to mind as I reflected on the words of the prophet Amos. The prophet was heartbroken because the people God had chosen as his very own were unfaithful to the covenant. He could not fathom how the people made in God's image and likeness refused to show lovingkindness to those in need. To him, it was mindboggling that people would choose to work themselves to death rather than allow themselves to find a resting place close to the heart of God. Moved with love and compassion for the people, Amos never lost hope that the people would someday meet again in the house of God. God saw all that the prophet Amos saw, and in the fullness of time provided a remedy for the problem. Seeing that the people he loved would not make their resting place in him, God, the Incarnate Word, pitched his tent in our midst. God became a man to reveal man to himself. Because people have become engrossed in the stuff of the world they have lost touch with their inner selves and keep racing, this way and that, in search of meaning and happiness. I found this wonderful passage in the Rule of the Master: "Our journey through this world has burdened us with many sins of negligence. The running sweat of labor, with our shoulders weary from the weight of this baggage, has made us aware of the proximity of death and we gasp with a burning thirst threatening destruction" (Theme, 5-6). Seeing the mess, we have made of our lives. God whispers in the ears of our hearts. "Be still and know that I am God" (Ps. 46:10). When the Son of God became man, He revealed the Father's heart to us. Because He is "the image of the invisible God" (Col.1:15) He restored the divine likeness that was lost by sin He who is the Way and the Truth, and the Life came to rescue the sons and daughters of his eldest brother from the Prince of Darkness and Lies. "Christ, the final Adam, by the revelation of the mystery of the Father and His love, fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear" (Gaudium et Spes, #22). Christ became a mirror that allows us to see what we are like. The Good Shepherd continues to seek out and reconciles those who have become strangers to God and themselves. The Word of God became our Brother in the Flesh so that we might find communion with His Father, meet again, and truly be the family God intended us to be. T.S. Eliot captures the thought in "Little Gidding"

"We shall not cease from exploration
And the end of all our exploring
Will be to arrive where we started
And know the place for the first time.
Through the unknown, remembered gate
When the last of earth left to discover
Is that which was the beginning..."

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I mentioned on Thursday that we would have a morning liturgy called a Blue Mass for those employed in public safety. As I have read it is a Mass of gratitude for those employed in public safety, as noted in the Ordo which is the liturgical guide for the celebration of liturgy. It also serves to commemorate those who died in service at the World Trade Center.



The Mass at 730 a.m. will be on September 29. On the ordering of times and seasons, as I was out with Beca earlier this week, I became aware of what are called passerine

birds. The large and tall tree near the residence was filled with starlings. This we appreciate is the undertaking of their annual migratory movement (journey some would say).

A southward journey.

A change of residence and transit from north to south. Transit in the manner of passing through from one residence to another. It occurred to me that they (the starlings) observe a pattern in their movement during the seasonal change. There is a word that I was unfamiliar with 'murmuration'. (I recalled teaching the bible school one summer some years back and asked the children to murmur as we were acting out the story of the Exodus and the people murmuring.) Rather murmuration is a flock of starlings. I see some association with our traveling together through this life into the next. I also see a connection as we are joined t ogether as one flock moving and feeding together with Jesus as our Shepherd. The notion of murmuring might still be relevant in the manner of complaint or dissatisfaction and finding fault and being critical. The kind of attitudes that create some separation from the flock (so to speak) and perhaps needs some reflection as to how to move in sync with the teachings of Jesus. Our own migratory movement is towards to the life of heaven. A journey that we continually undertake with the presence of the Eucharist within each one of us. Our true home is in heaven but at the same time we abide with Jesus sacramentally. May the habits of some of what we experience in nature be an impetus to move in the direction of union continually with Jesus as His blessed communion moving towards the life of heaven

I had an earworm this week in that the catchy song repeated "All Is Well With My Soul" written by Horatio Gates Spafford. I first heard this years ago and I like the Carey Landry version the best. (There are different versions with different words.) The song is written to be slow and dignified and sound emotional and I love it played on the organ. Earworms are impulsive things, they pop out of nowhere and stay. I feel they stay until the song is not just in my mind but my heart. This song with these words reminded me about faith. While listening to these words and music I was reminded about humility and faith. Faith in the words that the peace God gives me is the reason that I walk in faith. That it is in that faith life's up and downs can take its toll and it is my faith that keeps me afloat. It is a song that is a slow reminder that with God all is well. There is a humility in that. I have to surrender whatever it is that I am controlling and trust someone other than me. I am reminded that life is not always easy and I can be prideful. I can pick at something I perceive wrong until it bleeds. In all actuality it is I who bleeds but when I put that something down and walk away I can acknowledge that if I trust in God, all is well with me. It is there that there is this all consuming change of heart. My heart and how I live is conditioned by His presence. It is the air I need to breathe. I bless God in gratitude for the His blessings and grace and acknowledge his greatness and holiness. The song reminds me that it is in His mercy and blessings that I can be honest with myself and say that I can do nothing without Him. The second to last line of Carey Landry's version of this song is "with gladness and joy I will sing your name" and then goes on to "all is well, all is well with my soul" I feel gladness and joy for being able to get up in the morning and see life all around me, have people around me and the places I need to go I find peace and compassion. I find mercy. My life, my hope, my prayer is based on God's presence. Again, it is with Him I find mercy and compassion. It is in that mercy and compassion that I experience love. I walk in faith, I walk in hope and in doing so I also find the ability to be honest with myself. I trust in God, and over time I have realized that what has made letting go of control easier with time. I am finding with each time that I hear the song, the words in my head, that believe more and more that with God "all is well."
