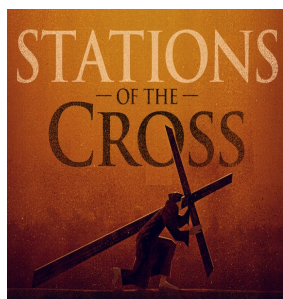

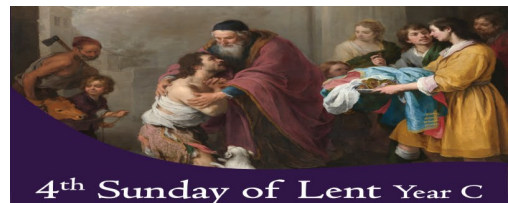

(Isaiah 49: 8 – 15; Ps 145; John 5: 17 – 30)

There are certain conversations that are very precious, a conversation in which someone reveals something very personal from the past or present. It is an act that speaks of trust, of confidence, of a sharing that draws people closer; such enhances friendship, touches lives deeply.

In today's Gospel Jesus reveals a number of times what is most precious to His heart – rather who is most precious – and it can be summed up in one word "Father". I have a sense that St. John joined a number of Jesus' statements said at different times into this one passage. Each statement is so profound, so very intimate and all of it together is too much to bear or comprehend worthily all at once. They really have to be taken singly and prayerfully. These words of the Lord captivated His followers more and more. Many said, "No one has ever spoken like this. No one has ever spoken with such authority, truth, passion." These same words distanced others from Him. They could not, would not listen; to them what He said was clear blasphemy and it would be used against him when He was put on trial. They stood in the crowd with His true followers not to learn but to gather evidence and bring Him to an end. We know that they would have their day.

We, by God's grace, are among those captivated to use the Cistercian Fathers' term "intoxicated – by the Lord Jesus Christ. May the message of today's Gospel and every Gospel we hear, move us to listen more deeply, more carefully, more receptively so that we are drawn more and more into the grace of our Baptismal relation with and in the Lord. With His first disciples we can and do say, "Lord, You have the words of eternal life" and by God's grace add, I pray to be more captivated, more intoxicated by Your word and into You.



4th Sunday of Lent Year C

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Lent as a season may be a time for reseed in the direction of growth in virtue. It also may be a time for redirection of certain habits or attitudes that impede the course of our development as disciples. At times we may need to remember that as baptized believers we are summoned (called maybe be a better word) to follow Jesus for the purpose of learning. There are many habits and attitudes that we may cultivate through our day to day. Lent may be a time to till and cultivate that which would be the fruits of the Holy Spirit.



Our daily routine (the old beaten path at times) may need a review of certain habits that are out of keeping with our development as disciples. Becoming rote or fixed in certain attitudes may need some thought as to how they may not be in keeping with development in likeness to Jesus. Am I/are we capable of change? That may be a good question to reflect on as well. Psalm 95 was the responsorial last weekend (as well as this past Thursday). The same psalm is also offered as an invitatory in the daily office that is part of the seven sacred pauses inclusive of the office of readings and morning and midmorning and midday and midafternoon and evening and compline (night prayer). An invitation to consider the direction of our lives throughout the day. The word invitation is also used in the scripture as a type of summons. In the course of our day to day we are called to proceed in likeness in the manner of our daily living to Jesus. The invitatory, I most use is the same psalm 95 where we read **HE IS OUR GOD AND WE ARE THE PEOPLE OF HIS PASTURE, THE SHEEP UNDER HIS CARE. TODAY, IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, HARDEN NOT YOUR HEARTS.** The psalm may be understood as an invitation to recognize how as followers of Jesus we are urged to hear His voice. The letter to the Hebrews also cautions against hardness of heart. Anticipating our Triduum celebration there is still time to prepare for our renewal of our Baptismal commitment. There is a time to consider our relationship to the vine as it is given to us in John's Gospel **I AM THE VINE, YOU ARE THE BRANCHES, IF YOU REMAIN IN ME AND I IN YOU, YOU WILL BEAR MUCH FRUIT.** May our hearts be disposed to be inclined in mind and heart to bear likeness to the Lord Himself. May we be pruned of any attitude or behavior that does not bear fruit useful for the building of the Kingdom.

In my Lenten journey every reading, psalm, hymn and prayer I contemplate through the lens of Jesus heading toward Holy Week. I ponder, meditate, think about rationally, what I hope to acquire in faith on this Lenten journey. Going into this fourth week of Lent I have found that walking this path can be a little



like Bobbi Bashing, all terrible and negative but that is never how I have looked at my Lenten journey. This week's Psalms for evening prayer were Psalms 125 and Psalms 131. They are Psalms of Ascent and what the Jewish people would pray on their way to Jerusalem for one of their festivals (Tabernacles is a good one). I have over time looked at my

Lenten journey like I was walking to Jerusalem. The steep and narrow roads that lead up into the city mirror the climb of life in general and what I am seeking. Reciting the Psalms of Ascent (Psalms 120-134) like the pilgrims on their journey, while trying to change my heart and life in the examination of it, one step at a time I have found how to make a journey peaceful and healing (Tabernacled with him). Psalm 125 reminded me that I am surrounded by God's love at all times. It is there solid and forever. I look at what distracts me and can acknowledge it and work on change because I am so loved, when I ask for forgiveness, it is given in compassion and peace. That is what I love about Lent, it gives me 40 days to reflect and the act of changing my heart is both interior and exterior, but also points out the love that leads us and why. I spend 40 days looking up, striving towards being a better person, the image of God to others in this struggling world. My Lenten journey is not taken alone. I participate with others, at Tuesday evening prayer where James 2:14-18 asks me to consider for all the weeks of Lent, are my faith and works the same or is my heart not in what I profess. I participate at Sunday Mass hearing in the Gospels, that Jesus too spent 40 days in fasting and prayer and that he told Satan to get behind him. I heard about the woman at the well and the man born blind both asking me to look where am I with these readings. It complicates my journey, makes the road steep and narrow but in doing so, it makes me continue up with hope and peace. That not only at the end of this journey will I find healing and peace that strengthen my faith, but that this happens with every step, every stumble, every look up to keep going. I know I am surrounded by love, that I am protected and loved. That the embrace happens with every step, every breath I take. This embrace that leads forward and to a change of heart also brings the faith that keeps me on the path, on the journey. God heals me without asking me to break. He heals one step at a time, asking only that I stay and that changes my heart and brings healing and peace. [I love Lent.](#)
