Continued from last weeks bulletin....

(Acts 1: 1-11, Ephesians 1:17-23, Luke 24:46-53)

We find this passage echoed in today's reading. "They worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy." The end of the story circles around and is a piece with the beginning. As Christ was presented in the Temple in Jerusalem, the Church, the Body of Christ, returns to Jerusalem to become the new Temple. The Son who came forth from the Father and became flesh in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary returned to the Father so that His Body might become flesh in the womb of the Church.

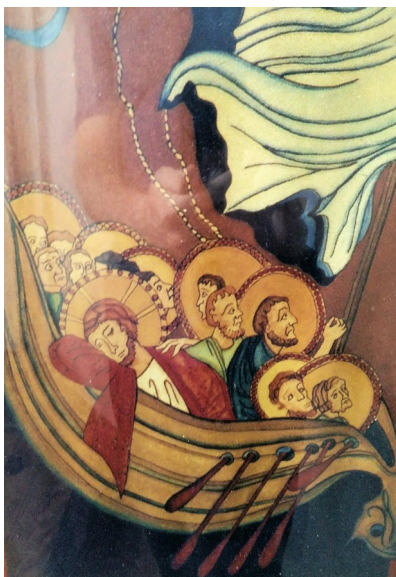
Christ's ascension is the definitive entrance of Jesus's humanity into the Father's heavenly kingdom. Today we focus our eyes on the one who was taken up and enthroned at the Father's right hand in glory. Christ's ascension is the cause of our joy. When he returned to the Father, he showed him the marks of the nails. When the Father beheld Christ's wounds, he was moved to even greater pity for us, not because we deserved it, but because of the Son's sacrificial love. Locked in an eternal embrace, the Father and the Son send the Spirit upon the church. Through the overshadowing of the Spirit, the Beloved Son opens the hearts of believers to hear the voice of the Father. As the Father sent Him, Christ now sends His disciples as the bearers of Good News to all the world. It is in the communion of the Trinity that the Church lives and moves ad has its being. Because He lives, we have abundant and eternal life (CF. Jn 14:19).

By his ascension, Christ draws our gaze to the heights of Heaven to show us that the end of our journey is the Father. As the Son entered his Father's loving embrace, he opened to us an infinite horizon, the ultimate goal of our earthly pilgrimage. In Christ's ascension into heaven, he took our human nature with him into the intimacy of the Godhead. Those who witnessed His going forth were commanded to keep their eyes and hearts open to encounter him, to serve him, and to bear witness to him throughout the whole world. The mission that the Lord entrusted to the apostles has continued through the centuries and continues even now. With the light and strength of the Holy Spirit, we can lead others to know and experience the loving compassion of God the Father and the tenderness of the Son. Like the disciples, we are called to encounter Christ in our brothers and sisters. Only then will our joy be complete.

As the Son goes forth to the Father, he tells the disciples to go forth in the name of the Father to proclaim the Good News. The Christian community is a community of "going forth" and announcing the Good News, and not of "standing still and looking into the heavens". Before his going forth, Jesus assured the disciples that they would receive the power of the Holy Spirit. Like them, we are called to be witnesses of Jesus, who lives in the Church and in the sanctuary of the human heart. "From the beginning, the Church has lived and understood the Death and Resurrection of Christ as a call by God to conversion in the faith of Christ and love of one another, perfected in mutual help even to the point of a voluntary sharing of material goods" (Justice in the World). May we be strong with the strength of faith, hope, and charity. May we be so consumed with the fire of divine love that we can carry on the great dialogue that is rooted in communion with the Blessed Trinity. May the Holy Spirit rest upon us and fill our hearts. May he make our hearts overflow with love so that we can draw all we meet into the communion of the Trinity.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Our celebration of Pentecost gives (perhaps the word that would be better is 'offers') us an opportunity (no matter at what point we are in our spiritual lives) to be transformed. A spiritual awakening perhaps and an opportunity to alter and change that which is not in keeping with the Holy Spirit. A timely and suitable time to consider our movement through life.



The Latin "ob portem veniens" translates coming to the port, OB is in reference to the wind towards the harbor. We read in Acts AND SUDDENLY THERE CAME FROM HEAVEN A NOISE LIKE A VIOLENT RUSHING WIND, AND IT FILLED THE WHOLE HOUSE WHERE THEY WERE SITTING. The physical house they were

inhabiting gives me the thought that the Holy Spirit also came to dwell within them as tents, as promised by Jesus. We read in the Gospel of John 14:15 to 31 that the Lord said 'the Father will send the Holy Spirit to live with you and be in you'. Going back to our movement through life we also read in II Kings 20 "In those days...the prophet Isaiah came and said PUT YOUR HOUSE IN ORDER" (in reference to the King Hezekiah). Putting our house in order may have to do with the management of the concerns of the house. Is it a stretch to consider (better be reminded) that we are members of the household of God? Servants of the Lord? In Mark 13:35 about the attitude of watchfulness. BE WATCHFUL. BE ALERT...IT IS LIKE A MAN TRAVELING ABROAD, HE LEAVES HOME AND PLACES HIS SERVANTS IN CHARGE...WATCH THERE; YOU DO NOT KNOW WHEN THE LORD OF THE HOUSE IS COMING. As we celebrate Pentecost may we be mindful of areas of our lives that might need some attentive repair and renewal. May the words of Jesus 'I will send you the Holy Spirit to teach and remind you everything I said to you.' May the Spirit guide our days and lives in the direction of the life of heaven as we pray His Kingdom come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven .

From Bobbi Bugai

The week leading to Pentecost, I find myself where I have been in earlier years of life. A reflection of Romans 8:26, "In the same way, the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness: for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings." The inexpressible groaning makes me smile as I ponder the Spirit knowing my heart, trying to lead, and my trying to put into words where there are none. (This is just my thoughts, no theological implications here.) I also remember an old song by Joe Wise "Lord Teach Us To Pray." It lists a lot of things that go on in life that I myself may or may not struggle with, but can see the wide divide of life. This is a joyful reflection because I have sometimes stood at the path of faith and said "which direction." What I have found is that the Spirit is never wrong. My biggest problem is me wanting to go the path of life and not the path of the Spirit. I like the easy way but where the Spirit leads is the path of peace. In letting the Spirit intercede where I have no words, only pain, I find the Spirit leads me to recognize the graces given and the strength to walk down paths that I would never have gone without guidance and the comfort knowing the Spirit leads. A few weeks ago at Confirmation I pondered on the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit, wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. I remember how they have all played a part in my 68 years of life. I have been given them all and all have changed my life in many ways. They have made me a better daughter, sister, wife, mother and grandmother. They have put at the forefront of my life, the intersection of faith and others. In most of these cases, the Spirit has led me out of myself and off Bobbi Land, into a world that has brought others to me, has brought me to others, and found a world where if the Spirit leads there is peace and comfort. With the Spirit I encounter love in the world, and stand in a spot of love where I would not have found without his "nudges". The Spirit leads, and I follow, but that is a choice that I have made and continue to make. What I have found, and continue to find, it is in doing so that I find love. Have all my prayers been answered, the answer is yes, because of the Spirit. Is it what I prayed for, no because I did not know what to pray for on that fork in the road. I could have prayed for one thing, and got another. That usually is what happens when the Spirit leads, you get a joyous, healing, peaceful surprise. This week's Gospel say "receive the Holy Spirit", I have and I have also received all the graces that go with that. I love following the Spirit

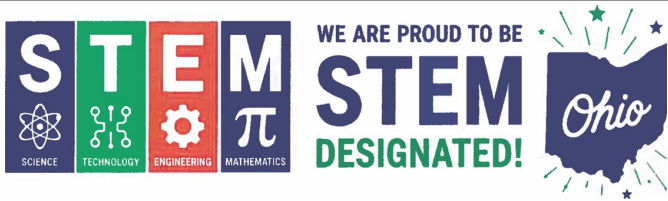
