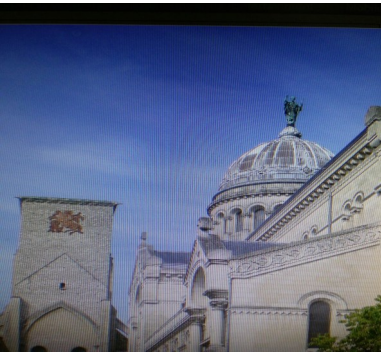
"It was the LORD who sent me to prophesy against this house and city all that you have heard" (Jer. 26:12). The prophet does not speak on his own authority. This is confirmed in a comment made by the prophet Amos. "I was not a prophet, and I was never trained as one. I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore trees. It was the Lord who took me from following the flock and sent me to preach to his people Israel" (Am. 7:14-15). God not only called the prophet, but he also put a huge burden on him, the need to speak a message that would bring salvation to the people. God allowed the prophet to see what he saw. God opened his heart to the prophet and allowed him to feel the agony of suffering humanity in all its horror. The prophetic utterance is the voice that God lends to the silent agony of the poor. God reveals his compassionate love through the empathic words of the prophet.

God's compassionate love for the poor and needy was, and remains, a challenge to the rich. The word of the Lord is rooted in compassion, not compromise. The prophet speaks of justice and mercy. Living among the people, the prophet's heart was moved to compassion. The misery of the people around him would not allow him to keep silent. The prophet was moved to compassion because he lived close to the heart of God. Having had a first-hand experience of the loving compassion of God, the prophet was commissioned to call his hearers to deal compassionately with the poor and marginalized. Each of us is called to be a light for those who wander in darkness. Each of us is called to be a sign of hope for those who are trapped in despair. Like Christ, each of us must be willing to drink the bitter cup of suffering so that others may drink the cup of salvation. The prophet Ezekiel spoke of the urgent demand placed on him by his calling. "Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the people of Israel; so, hear the word I speak and give them warning from me" (Ezek. 33:7). Jeremiah gave a rather graphic description of what happened when he tried to walk away from the call. "But if I say I will never mention his word or speak in his name, his word burns in my heart like a fire. It is like a fire shut up in my bones. I am utterly worn out trying to hold it in. I cannot keep silent" (Jer. 20:9). The apostle to the gentiles understood the source of this urgency. "The love of Christ compels us" (2 Cor. 5:14). The prophet's words are rooted in the heart of God. God so loved the world that he created us with a capacity to know and love him. He planted in our heart's desire to seek the truth and gave us a mission to share it with others. The Master of the Universe has called each of us by name. He wrote His Word on the tablets of our hearts. He who has spoken heart-to-heart with us has called us to speak heart-to-heart with one another. This heart-to-heart conversation will lead us to do the truth in love. As we allow God's word to echo in our hearts, we will become instruments to help others to hear the gentle voice and open their eyes to recognize God's loving presence in their lives.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This past Thursday, (amid some liturgical adaptations i.e. the Birth of John the Baptist) we listened to the final words of the Sermon on the Mount. The conclusion resulted in accepting a challenge of building a house on sand or on rock. I have read that the Book of Proverbs gives us 'By wisdom a house is built, and by



understanding it is established' (Proverbs 24:3). We read as well in Proverbs 12:7 'the house of the just stands firm' while in Proverbs 14:11 'the house of the wicked will be destroyed'.

We may appreciate that this is an invitation to put into practice the teaching of Jesus and perhaps to consider where there is need of repair to putting back into order as we (how often do we consider this?) await the return of Jesus. The direction of Blessedness is given us in our being consecrated at our Baptism, as we were anointed with the Holy Spirit and given a candle symbolic of the light of Christ, as well as the presence of the Holy Spirit (recall tongues of flame in the Acts of Apostles igniting the new community). In Matthew 28:19 we read of that discipleship begins with the initiation in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. At Jesus's own baptism in chapter 3 the Spirit descended and the Father spoke THIS IS MY BELOVED SON IN WHOM I AM WELL PLEASED. And with baptism comes instruction. Inclusive not only the imparting of knowledge but also formation. Back to the conclusion of the Sermon on the Mount and the words of Jesus heard, (the sermon itself) and I suppose the question for us all, do we put them into practice which is (I have read as something of a daily challenged) shaped and directed by the commands of Jesus. Considering the choices offered by the conclusion as to where we build also asks us to consider how foundational is our relationship with Jesus. A consideration of our base of relationship with Jesus. May we consider what it is to be conscious of the kind of mending and reparation (if needed) and putting back into order the ONE who dwells within us and the ONE we house.

From Bobbi Bugaj

I have been meditating on Psalm 146 for the last couple of days and have discovered a few things about myself. Psalm 146 speaks about praise, trust, and that God is eternal, God is a helper, gives sight to the blind, and the creator of all. We prayed it at Tuesday night evening prayer at The Vigil of John the Baptist. There are various paths I could have gone down but the path I chose was faith in God and how I proclaim it.

I do not praise God enough in my life. My meditation went like this: How can I be a "voice" in today's world that sometimes feels like I am in the wilderness and reconcile that to the God I know to be in Psalm 146. What do I "see" in Psalm 146? Well first of all, I never thank God enough. In all the hard times and especially in the good times, I can forget that there is nothing I can do without him. I praise God in my prayers and in my thoughts. I will tell people how much He has done for me, but do I do it daily? Maybe not so much. More times or not, I do not notice, but when I do, I am grateful. Do I trust God? More than anything else in this world. I have great stories about trust and choosing to do the right thing at a difficult time. What comes to mind the clearest is the decision to take Mom to hospice. I struggled with it quite a bit but when God let me feel at peace with it, it was right decision. Mom got her peace and I got mine. Not without struggle but with dignity for both of us. I have learned over my lifetime that trust in God has never been bad, it has always been miraculous. I learned over time and am learning daily, God never fails. God as helper is awesome. Over my 68 years, this path that can be hard and I admit, I stumble, has always been the right one. I can start to waiver about decisions or have anxiety about am I doing the right thing and God will put someone in my day that changes those thoughts and fears. I also lose those thoughts in my prayer time and God has told me more than once "Listen to the words of your prayers in your heart." I become the blind who see. I see the world through the eyes of Joyce Kilmer's words in the poem Trees. I only need to look at what God created to see him. I can see how the world around me praises God and honors him. I can do a lot of things, but I cannot create a world of beauty without him. The words echo "Only God can make a tree." I get happy, peaceful thought when I acknowledge that I am human but God is everlasting. That I follow and walk a path where others have gone before me and guided me to this moment when I find joy in the world of sharing God with others. Psalm 146 gave me an insight into those things that I have and the desire to always be with God. I praise God for all of this. It is all good and it is all grace but it is nice to know, that sometimes I should look at all the graces and say to God "I love you, I trust you and will follow you." Amen
