# Guest Article: Rev. Jerome Machar OCSO Continued from last week....

We are called to proclaim the truth that sets all people free. Remember, God sent his Son into the world to save it, not condemn it (CF. Jn. 3:17). In a fragmented world, we are called to shine brightly as agents of healing and reconciliation. Because we fail at the task so often, I offer Gandhi's comment as a reminder. "I like your Christ, I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ" (Mahatma Gandhi). Compassion is the healing ointment our world needs. Jesus gave us an example that we should love one another and bear each other's burdens with love and compassion. As disciples of Christ, we are called to seek out and find the lost. We are not to be agents of retribution but of reconciliation.

Saint John tells us why we can act this way in the face of overwhelming trials and conflicts. "You, dear children, belong to God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world" (1 Jn. 4:4). We are disciples of Christ who shines brightly as the heavens. He was raised up in glory because he laid down his life for the salvation of the world. He was given a name above all other names because he became a curse to redeem those who were cursed. Those who live the truth in love will be lights of hope, leading people to freedom and life. Once we have removed the burdens of those who are exhausted and overworked, they will raise their voices in joyful song and dance with abandon before the throne of God.

"In the end souls will stand naked before the judge. It no longer matters what they once were in history, but only what they are in truth" (Spe Salvi, #44, Pope Benedict XVI). God who is faithful and true to his word will show us the path to life and bring us to the fullness of joy in his presence. There we shall shine like the splendor of the firmament, and be like the stars shining out in the heavens. Today we have gathered around the Table of the Lord to thank him for admitting us into the kingdom of Light that darkness cannot overcome. The reason for our joy is that we can serve the King of Life who came that we might have abundant life. We have been invited to the Wedding Feast of the Lamb, let us eat until we are filled and drink until we are refreshed. Then we will shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament and light up this dark world with the twinkling of our stars.

## FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

There were a couple of admonitions in St. Paul's letter to the Romans. Actually, one admonition that remains a challenge for many today and the other an appreciation of (an instruction perhaps) of what it is to boast in the Lord. The first was about presumption or taking for granted our participation in the resurrected life that was initiated at Baptism. The boasting then is based upon the justification we received at baptism so



that we are bound to live in likeness to Jesus as well. Inasmuch as there was a restoration of humanity through the reparation of the sin of Adam and Eve and so came the renewal of life as children of God and brothers and sisters in Christ. The questions becomes (for me) "Do I boast in the Lord? Do I delight in the Lord? Do I feel the joy of the Lord?" That would ask for some daily reflection

and some thoughtfulness in appreciating whether I seek to reflect the image of Jesus in practical imitation. Or do I simply presume that is the truth without giving it any more consideration. In celebrating Margaret Mary Alacouge I was reminded of her devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Through apparitions she received there came the development of The First Friday Devotions. Many of us as children learned and practiced the First Fridays. Included in the practice was the invitation to pray for an hour (for some before the Blessed Sacrament) on Thursday as Jesus prayed in the Garden of Olives. It was also the habit of celebrating reconciliation on the same day in anticipation of receiving the Eucharist on Friday. I learned (can't recall where) that Saturday may be given to live in likeness to the first disciple of Jesus being Our Lady and Holy Mother who carried His presence within her. And so, a kind of rhythm that may assist in preparing monthly and not presuming a direction of life as those justified and carry the presence within ourselves. May we be alert to the daily possibility to boast in the Lord in practical imitation. May we be free of any attitude or disposition that takes for granted our participation in the Eucharist. May we daily be open to the kind of examination of conscience that assists in revealing the One we are baptized into and seek to imitate.

## From Bobbi Bugaj

I look forward with appreciation the psalter. It can take you on unexpected journeys of discovery and healing and gratitude. Psalm 137: 1-6 was on the past Tuesday's evening prayer. The journey became an examination of conscience but in a very fulfilling way. (Note: my own thoughts only.) According to the footnote in my Catholic Study Bible the psalmist (a Temple singer) is on alien soil by the rivers of Babylon and demands are being made on the psalmist to play and sing. He answers no in what is most dear to him, "his hands and tongue." He hung up his harp because he could not play. I thought of "waters flowing" and how my life continues on in good times and in bad. How the water continues to flow whether I am by known waters or strange waters. I ask myself the guestion, are they the same waters and am I missing something? I could think of no answer but I know the sound of the water flowing is the same. I thought of my baptism and the fact that I am a child of God. There have been times in my life when I got distracted off the path and found myself looking again to recognize God's presence because it was me who set up the barriers. Those barriers bring a longing in my heart to acknowledge again the faith that brings love. Remembering prayer time when silence brought healing and peace instead of my mind racing on the to do list. Remembering the hands part, I think of people I walk by without saying hello. The everything is about me and my needs. when really it is not. The alien soil has brought me back to Bobbi Land and the disconnect that follows. Bobbi Land can be cruel in tongue, short with people but it is remembering the peace that changes hearts and the reconciliation that brings peace and healing. These bring me outside of my world, to see the image of God in the world. It is in the creation and the image of God in others. God brings me back to the path that is not on alien soil, that changes the hands to help others and the tongue to be kind and loving. God changes the heart and the heart reaches out to others. Returning to the path to eternal life, it is enlightening. It shows where to work and sometimes points in a direction that shows how you got distracted. It allows what you hung up to pick up again and reconciliation allows not just healing and peace but rejuvenation that brings joy. It is in the healing and restoration that harps are picked up and my heart's singing begins. It is hard to explain that this is a joyful article and not Bobbi Bashing but that is peace that comes with reconciliation. Hard to read but the joy of the road taken when walked in faith and trust is loving. It is there that I recognize compassion, mercy, forgiveness and the acknowledgement toward eternal life that is joyful. I may again get distracted and end up on alien soil, but I know the way back, I know that I will be forgiven and loved and lead on the path in faith.

I can sing.
