# Light on the Liturgy

2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter: A Gospel Morality

"The Kingdom of God is at hand." Jesus, especially by his suffering, death and resurrection, has re-established the reign of God over creation. This means that the reign of Satan, the reign of sin and evil, introduced into God's good creation by human sin, no longer has power over us. This means that, with God's help, we can live according to God's way, the way he intended at creation. Sin and evil do continue to exist in the world, but they do not control how we live. (Recall Jesus' parable of the weeds and the grain--Mt. 13/24-30). However, it is part of our mission, as followers of Christ and members of his Kingdom, to help overcome that sin and evil until he returns to complete his work.

The beauty of God's plan is that we don't have to figure out for ourselves what this means in daily life. By his actions throughout Salvation History, God has revealed to us who he truly is and thus how he lives. The very nature of God is a life of love and self-sacrifice for the other - within the Trinity and toward creation. This ultimately is what our belief in the Trinity is all about – self-giving for the others. And this is the true meaning of love. Our lives, as a People created in the image and likeness of God, should imitate God's life of love. This is living according to God's Way. This, however, can be vague, can still leave us searching; but God has not left us wandering aimlessly in a desert of uncertainty. He also answered this question for us. The Son of God himself, the Second Person of the Trinity, has taken on human nature, has become one with us and thus has revealed fully who God is and, through his example and teaching, has taught us what it means to live God's Way in our daily lives.

So we look to the Gospels to find God's way. It s there that he teaches us how to live as members of God's Kingdom, to live in a world where our God of goodness and love reigns supreme and where, by our lives, we share in Christ's mission to finally overcome sin and evil and "build the City of God." # FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

In the seminary I lived three doors down from Fr. John McCaffery who was the spiritual director during my preparation for ordination. I recall his being available to the



students and his good counsel and his humor. During Holy Week we assisted at the Cathedral during our first three years and it was after one Easter celebration that Fr. Mac shared how the Emmaus walk in the Gospel of Luke

should be given attention and consideration as to our disposition and orientation. I appreciated that his direction of attentiveness to the two who were part of the 'walk' with Jesus was a time of instruction and clarity. They went from being disoriented and a mood of disappointment to a renewed state of mind and heart as well as being redirected as they returned to share what they had experienced in walking with Jesus and then sharing in the breaking of the bread. The section from the Gospel of Luke is an opportunity to consider how attentive we are to how we walk daily with Jesus. I recall reading that the song "In The Garden" was written by one C. Austin Miles who, according to his great granddaughter wrote the lyrics in a cold and dreary basement that had no window and no view of a garden. Many of us know the refrain AND HE WALKS WITH ME AND HE TALKS WITH ME. The Emmaus account might be an apt meditation for many of us as it might prompt us to appreciate the many contrary voices in the culture as well as be a source of direction and being oriented to share with others (as best as we can) that which is the fruit of our prayer and a disposition to be an influence for the good and holy. A guick reading sometimes suffices but a thoughtful reading of the walk can have the effects of being transformed as those who communicate the Good News of the Gospel. May we be oriented towards the life of heaven as we often say in the prayer that Jesus taught. May we be attentive in our movement through life as those who are missioned to share the peace of Christ.

# From Bobbi Bugaj

My Mom and Dad would often take us to the upper peninsula of Michigan for a camping vacation each year. We would stay for about a week. We would camp at Brimley State Park which is located on Lake Superior. From the beach you could see the big freighters heading into the Soo Locks. If we jumped into the car and went to the locks we would get there in time to see them lock through. You are very close to the freighters and could really experience the size of them. They were huge. That being said, on other beaches in Michigan because of the constant waves, you noticed that these beaches were filled with rocks and none of the rocks had sharp edges. That was from the constant waves from the water. I could not tell you what type of rocks they are, just that when you looked at them the whites of them would match a newly white painted wall and the quartz in the rocks would sparkle in the sunshine. And again, no sharp edges. I once gathered a few to take them home and after just a short time, I noticed that the rocks lost their shine. They became dull. The next year, I snuck them back to the beach, they needed to be near the water. What do these two thoughts have in common for me, this week I have been reflecting on the empty tomb and the thought, I have experienced the Risen Lord. I can be a freighter carrying the Word of the Lord to others just by doing what I do in my life. From a distance I can seem small but up-close with the Holy Spirit, I bring a much-needed message. Since God gives me many talents at the same time I can be a living rock. By my baptism, I am washed clean and with Holy Communion and Confirmation I only get brighter. I am infused by that which becomes an integral part of me. (I also physically see what happens to me when I move away from that source and the need to return to it.) The Holy Spirit leads and I follow but in the infusion of the Spirit and the willingness to follow this path I have seen the Risen Lord. I found that in the following and staying near that I shine with the love of the Lord and the message that I have seen the Risen Lord. I carry that so very important message lovingly and to others who need to hear it. I am not insignificant in this world because of Christ. The Lord is Risen!
