 Feast of Dedication of Lateran Basilica
 Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12
 John 2: 13-22

“Wherever this water flows, the sea shall be made fresh” (Ezek. 47:8). The water flowing from the temple brings abundant life. We are the temple of the living God, and our living Lord causes rivers of living water to flow from our hearts (CF. Jn. 7:38). He who is the creator and sustainer of life will make us fountains of life-giving water for a thirsty world. The flow may begin as an insignificant trickle, but touched by the Spirit, it can satisfy the deepest thirst of every human heart. The Spirit dwelling in a temple made of living stones is the fountain of living water that flows through each believer into the world. From the living stones will flow rivers of living water to refresh and renew all God’s people.

A church building is brick and mortar, wood and glass, but the outstretched hands of the crucified Master support it. Its cornerstone is the stone rejected by the builders and pierced with the soldier’s lance. From that crevice in the rock, streams of living water flowed that became a cleansing bath in which we were freed from sin and made heirs of eternal life. The stone rejected by men has selected us to be water vessels for those longing for living water. As Jesus was willing to pour himself out to manifest his great love for the world, he wants us to be willing to pour ourselves out for the sake of the heavenly kingdom. Because we have thirsted for truth, good, and beauty, we can understand the thirst of our brothers and sisters. “We must discover the power of love, the redemptive power of love. And when we discover that, we will be able to make this old world a new world. We will be able to make men better. Love is the only way... Oh God, help us in our lives and all of our attitudes, to work out this controlling force of love, this controlling power that can solve every problem that we confront” ([Martin Luther King, Jr., “Loving Your Enemies”](#)).

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Housekeeping was a direction given in St Paul's letter to the Philippians this past week. The care and maintenance of the One who dwells within us. A routine cleansing of a sort which we recall each time we begin



our liturgy. A consideration of looking at and keeping in mind that which we may thoughtfully consider as out of keeping with the presence of Christ within us. St Paul spoke of the circumcision of the heart (that is also found in Romans). In the old covenant it was an outward sign of being set apart for God while our hearts (through baptism) (new covenant) are purified and so asking for a daily change of

heart. Ideally it is about inward change and development about our thoughts and words and deeds. For some (including myself) it may be routine. The word suggests a ritual that is both customary and mechanical. We recall too that the people of Philippi may have fallen to some practices that were not suggestive of them waiting for the Day of the Lord and His return. Back to housekeeping and the management of the same, I find the tasks of dusting and laundry and vacuuming and decluttering that which needs both focus and setting aside of time for the purposes of maintenance. While working at the restaurant some years ago I was tasked with caring and maintaining the dining area. My Saturday mornings included moving furniture and getting into corners of the eating place to (in a sense) refresh the place where folks would share a meal. (That also included the patio and garden area which were popular in summer time). It occurs to me that in preparation for the meal which is our Eucharist that we can prepare before the liturgy to seek a change of heart in acknowledging that which is out of keeping with the proper maintaining of Christ within our hearts. It may be arguable that we can be self-cleaning which has to do with the exterior. We read in the letter of John (1:7) that if we have fellowship ... and the blood of the lamb cleanses us from all sin. Perhaps something to appreciate as we prepare for our liturgy. May we have the disposition of the kind of care and maintenance of the presence within us. May we as well await His return as He has promised in time.

While thoughtfully preparing to lead Evening Prayer this last week, the thought that came to mind is that I receive from God those same things that He asks of me. The Reading was Romans 12:9-12. We read: "Your love must be sincere. Detest what is evil, cling to what is good. Love one another with the affection of brothers. Anticipate each other in showing respect. Do not grow slack but be fervent in spirit; he whom you serve is the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient under trial, persevere in prayer." I meditated on sincere. Without blemish. God loves me no matter what. If I fail, he forgives. He does the exact same actions as the father in the prodigal child. (And I can be either child.) I am loved and welcomed back. The same loving care that I experience with God in my life. I am never alone. There is a respect part. That is because disagreements should be treated with patience and respect. God respects my not so good decisions but always lovingly calls me back. God respects me as His child, and knows that sometimes children make bad decisions that get them split lips and knocks on the head, but when I go to my loving Father, he holds me and comforts me. He might even say, I tried to get you not to do that. I am sorry for your pain. I have to admit, God has never led me astray! He asks the same respect towards others that he gives me. God does serve me and asked that I serve others. Be fervent in spirit. According to Merriam-Webster that mean "exhibiting or marked by great intensity of feeling." That really explains the Spirit leading me. It might be hard and painful but always beautiful. In all of these lines from Romans, I am asked to give back to others, what I have received lovingly and freely. This love changes my heart and brings on a desire to continue.
