(Philemon 7-20, Luke 17: 20-25)

“I do not think it an overstatement to say that the purpose of life is to love whoever is around to be loved” (Kurt Vonnegut, *Sirens of Titan*, pg. 253). God is love and He made us in his image and likeness. God also makes the rain fall on the good and the bad alike. Being made in the image and likeness of God, we are to love always and to love everyone. Having been made in the image of the farmer who sows seed with abandon, we are to spread the love lavishly, not choosing who is to receive it. Saint Paul found great joy in all the good Philemon did. By conforming our hearts to the heart of Christ, we become sources of hope for those in need. We can give love because we have received love from God. He has made us stewards of his loving kindness toward all we meet. We have been created in the image and likeness of our loving Father and we insult him whenever we are miserly in extending love and compassion toward others. The Beloved Son poured himself out for our salvation. Having been made in his image and likeness, we should pour ourselves out making his salvation known to the world. Everything we have is a gift from him, so what have we to lose? If we squander on others what he has squandered on us, we are only taking after our prodigal Father. He grants deliverance to captives. He breaks the chains of sin. He opens the eyes of the blind. He feeds with the bread of life those who hunger and thirst for salvation. He is the constant companion of the poor. He shows mercy to the lost. All the Father has done through the Son, He wants to continue doing through us. “For God, who said, ‘Let light shine out of darkness,’ made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God’s glory displayed in the face of Christ” (2 Cor.4:6). Through Baptism, we have been grafted to Christ. Because Christ lives in us, the Kingdom of God is among us. God has pitched his tent in our hearts and abides with us just as he abided with His only-begotten Son. Christ who is nearest to the Father’s heart desires to set our hearts ablaze with the Fire of Divine Love. Because of the glory shining on His face, we can radiate his light to the world. Because the Kingdom of heaven is at hand, the people who walk in the valley of darkness have seen a great light. When Christ stretched out his arms in the everlasting sign of love, the fire of divine love vanquished the realm of darkness and death forever. “We are living at a time when humanity, connected as never before, appears much more divided than united... we continue to find ourselves on the brink of a delicate precipice and we do not want to fall... We appear to be witnessing a dramatic and childlike scenario: in the garden of humanity, instead of cultivating our surroundings, we are playing instead with fire, missiles and bombs, weapons that bring sorrow and death, covering our common home with ashes and hatred... let us open our hearts to our brothers and sisters; let us press forward on the journey towards greater knowledge and understanding of one another. Let us strengthen the bonds between us, without duplicity or fear, in the name of the Creator who has put us together in this world as guardians of our brothers and sisters. So that, together, we may be prophets of community, artisans of unity, and builders of peace” (Pope Francis in Bahrain).

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The word "season" may be used in different contexts. Tempus per annum or ordinary time follow the Seasons of Advent and Lent. Ordinary time began this past Monday following our celebration of Pentecost. The prior



seasons are preparation for the birth and later for the Resurrection of our Lord. And so, the seasons of the liturgical year. One may ask about how well we have been seasoned

in the manner of improvement and the bearing of fruit. The Latin word "serere" is 'to sow'. Both Matthew and Luke offer the Parable of the Sower. One of the prayers at the Abbey of Genesee that is offered at the end of Matins is May the Lord plant the hope of the Gospel in our heart and may it be evident in our ways. Members of our Dave Matt gardening community have been meeting to prepare the soil for the growth of what some have already seeded and so prepared for growth. The preparation of the soil. In Luke we read of the generosity of the farmer who casts his seed. Trying to use all the land available. That which is sown represents the Word of God as Jesus begins His preaching. And so identified are those who heard only superficially. The word did not penetrate in their hearts. We read of the rocky ground and those who believe but fall away in times of trial. Not rooted or as Fr. Bode would say "in the fleshy tablets of their hearts". The thorns indicate the presence of possible anxieties and the need for detachment from that which weighs us down and as in chapter 21 those who await His second coming.

The conclusion

**WHO EVER HAS EARS TO HEAR OUGHT TO HEAR**

and repeated again in Luke 14 that asks for a commitment to a fruitful life of discipleship. As those seeded, may this Ordinary time be a time to be guided by the seed of God's word and direct our lives to blossom and flower and bloom and grow. May we prepare the soil of our hearts and minds to bear the produce of the Gospel.

In our celebration of Pentecost in the Gospel Jesus says “Peace be with you.” I always noticed Jesus spoke the words twice, one when he first appeared and then just right before the missioning. This Sunday we hear the words “For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.” I have been saved through him. I have been baptized, received the sacraments and follow a path in his footsteps. I love this journey and in the last few weeks I have thought about joy and healing that starts with the Father sending the Son, the Son returns to the Father and the Spirit is sent. I sometimes think this sounds so stark but you know what I have discovered and continue to do so, it is this that brings joy and healing. With my faith and the Spirit leading, I have found peace in the most stressful of times. I have woken up afraid and angry, then prayed and it is in that moment, I can see with both my eyes and my heart the beauty of the world. I walked out in my yard one afternoon to find a deer in my back yard who just looked at me and then went on its agreeable way. It did not startle, it did not run, it just looked at me and then calmly walked (hopped in this case) away. That made me smile because our back yard is enclosed by a fence. I thought of how many fences that deer would have to hop to go on his way and in that moment, I was acknowledged, deemed safe and life continued for both of us. God was there reminding me to look at the deer being loved and remember, I am too. That deer had many fences to jump over because all the yards on my street are fenced in, but the deer hopped them knowing at this time, he was safe in God’s care. I also thought that this is faith, the faith to know safety and seeing joy in just being there. Life has fences and I do not walk them alone. The smile of joy and peace that both the deer and I can say, “Yeah this looks odd, one or both of us should be running, but we are not, shows the peace that all understanding cannot explain. That peace makes the grass greener, the smell of lilacs in my yard becomes healing and the sounds of the birds I cannot see, clearer. In these moments, I am healed and find a happiness that is not present without my acknowledgement of God being present. That joyful moment makes the day. It is in these moments the word “peace be with you” stir in my heart and it is true, I am at peace. A peace that sometimes make me laugh at myself when acknowledging that the Spirit is restoring to the moment what I have forgotten. I am loved. This path I follow, these nudges of the Spirit that says see what love the Father has bestowed on you. He sent his Son and when the Son ascended the Spirit came. I am missioned but never alone. I find joy, laughter and healing. *I love my faith.*
