Philemon 7-20 Luke 17: 20-25

"If you regard me as a partner, welcome [Onesimus] as you would me" (Phil. 17). Having been grafted to Christ, we are all one in Christ. The bond of love that draws us together is stronger than any force in the world. It is Christ's heartfelt prayer that we be one in him as he is one with the Father. Unity of mind and heart are not optional. We need to learn how to work together and to bridge the gaps that keep us apart. Having been embraced by Christ, let us welcome each other as we would Christ.

The main character in today's first reading, Onesimus, Philemon's slave. For some unknown reason, he decided to run away from his master's service. The name Onesimus means "profitable" or "useful." When Onesimus took to his heels, he was useless to Philemon. The runaway slave made his way to the apostle in chains who showed him the way to freedom in Christ. Through baptism into Christ, he who had been an unprofitable servant to his master became a useful comrade to Paul. Through the power of the gospel, the prisoner is unchained and the slave is set free. Both embrace each other as children of God and heirs of the Kingdom. God, the creator of the universe became a lowly servant in search of us, his unprofitable servants. By the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, God gave us a second chance. Let us allow him to make us who were useless useful. May he regard us as his partners in the work of building up the kingdom of his Father.

FROM The PASTOR'S DESK

On the memorial of Paul of the Cross I was recollecting a Vigil prayer offered at the Abbey of the Genesee. Thinking back, it was prayed at the close of the 3:30 am service and the prayer was "May the Lord enlighten our spirit that the night of sin



maybe driven away by His inward shining. "The main apostolate of the Passionate (the mission of spreading the good news) is offering parish missions. I have read they were founded in order to 'teach people how to pray'. I wonder how illuminated in mind and heart and how well informed we are by our participation in daily prayer and worship.

Are we conscious of a direction of driving away that which is behavior out of keeping with the Gospel while we await the return of Jesus.

Keeping vigil is having the stance of being watchful about the return of Jesus. We read in Matthew 25 "keep your eyes open, for you do not know the day or the hour." Recall the circumstance of the ten virgins as they awaited the bridegroom who was delayed. Recall that they began to nod and fall asleep. Five were prepared to enter and five were not. All ten were awaiting His coming. May we say that the ones prepared were ready for His return. They not only saw it as a summons to vigilance but also producing the fruit of the enlightening Spirit as well. How enlightened are our hearts with patience and kindness and love and faith and self-control? How well do we illuminate and shine and send forth and radiate the presence of Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit? We recall that Jesus said to His disciples that the Father would send forth the Holy Spirit in His name to teach and remind them of all that He taught them. May we be vigilant about the return of Jesus. May we be free of darkness (sin and the absence of light) by daily seeking to be enlightened in a manner that reveals and shows the sacred presence. The Latin "monstrare" gives us the word for monstrance. Thinking back to parish missions there is an opportunity to pray in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist placed in the monstrance. Inasmuch as it is a vessel used to display the presence we too have the capacity to hold and contain the presence to be displayed in our day to day.



I at time I do not get a head of my arthritis pain and as anyone who suffers as well from will tell you, you have to stay ahead of the pain. You have to listen and follow what your doctor tells you to do. Sometimes easier said than done. Chronic pain can wear me down and wipe me out. The same is true in my prayer life. I have to follow the pattern, the rhythm of doing it daily with attention and the knowledge that I must surrender to the Divine Physician. Surrender does not come easily to me, although I am learning to do it one moment at a time. One bad habit at a time. Although I say the words "thy will be done" daily, I find myself struggling to do it. Vanity and pride try to override faith and trust and I sometimes wonder why. Sometimes I have to step out of the rhythm of life and find in the guiet and the silence, the ability to surrender something is beyond my control. It is in peace and understanding I find that I might have been ignoring something that is potentially harmful in the long run. I did that earlier in the week and what I found was rest, peace, and the ability to sit in the silence of God's presence without squirming. Taking deep breaths and just sitting in one spot, closing my eyes to appreciate the silence. I found myself in the beauty of the moment, the ability to feel the Holy Spirit guiding me to open my heart to let him lead. So, Wednesday, I sat in silence. I remembered one of my favorite saying from Mother Teresa "We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. See how nature – trees, flowers, grass – grows in silence; see the stars, the moon and sun, how they move in silence..." By taking the moment, the time to step out and just enjoy the silence, the extended time of doing nothing, just existing, I was reconnected to something that I had not even known was slipping noisily away. The reminder that while God is always there, I can push his presence away even sometimes when I sit to pray, when I forget that sitting in silence means stilling my mind too. Sitting in silence is surrendering my mind, my heart and my body to God. Harder to do sometimes more than others, but what I realized this week was how easily it came when I realized that it was the silence and God's presence that became my heart's desire. It was in the silence that my heart reached out to what I knew I would find, what I trusted with my heart and what allowed healing, peace and understanding, the voice of God in silence that allows me to see God everywhere and in everything. That makes my days lighter and my nights restful. It is in the silence that I find and allow my heart to experience what is around me, God's healing, God's love, most of all, I can hear God's
